Must Call Off Strike

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 8.—If the officials of the United Mine Workers do not withdraw the order calling out four hundred thousand miners on a strike by six o'clock November 11th they will be held in contempt of court and deal with accordingly, according to an order issued by Federal Judge Anderson today.

Judge Anderson gave the leaders of the strike until the above date to end the strike, or at least withdraw the strike order, and he also made the restraining order a temporary injunction which restrains the leaders from calling further strikes until the case can be tried.

OUR AFFILIATION IS IN DANGER

Prof. S. M. N. Marrs, chief supervisor of high schools of Texas, was one of the principal speakers at the teachers' institute here this week, and sounded a note which our local high school should get the full meaning of, and act accordingly.

Mr. Marrs stated that no high school could retain its affiliation with colleges and universities of first rank, that did not maintain a nine months' free term with all pupils entitled to free school admitted.

This means that a school can not teach part of its nine months term on free school basis, and then if the money plays out continue the school on a paid tuition basis, admitting only those pupils who pay their tuition.

The local board has made no statement as to what the income for the local school will be, or whether the income will be sufficient to meet the expenses of a nine months term or not, but those familiar with the condition here-fore are a little suspicious of a shortage.

The school funds will probably be no more than for the last term, while the expenses will be greater, due to a necessary increase in salaries and a larger faculty than last year.

In case of a shortage the school will lose its affiliation unless the people go down in their pockets and by private subscription keep the school going on a free term basis for full nine months. The tuition scheme will not work, if we are to retain our affiliation.

NEGRO ADMITS HE PASSED BAD CHECK

After being faced with facts he could not deny, Luther Kellen, held for forgery, made a confession and told Sheriff Perkins that he had the "right nigger."

Kellen was caught at the Santa Fe station Friday morning as he was about to board the East bound train, and about thirty minutes after he had attempted to pass a bad check at the Rogers-Higdon Co. store.

It later developed that a bad check had been passed the night before at Rosenwasser's store by a negro. The clerks who waited on the negro at both places, could not identify the negro. In fact they said he was not the negro, and the officers were about to conclude that they had made a water haul and did not have the right negro, when the negro began to talk and tried to lay the crooked work on another negro.

Mr. Perkins went to the country and brought the other negro in, and he proved to be a good witness against the negro who was in jail, and the first negro fessed up.

It developed that the negro Kellen changed his clothes after passing the bad checks, and changed his appearance in such a way as to prevent identification. Mr. Perkins later found the negro's grip in a negro joint on Seventh Street, near the Santa Fe station, and found the clothes, and hat which the negro had on when he passed the checks. Dressing the negro up in the clothes and carrying him back to the stores where he passed the bad checks, the clerks readily identified him, and say they will swear that he is the negro.

100 PERCENT PERFECT FOR THE BIG DRIVE

Rev. Alvin Swindell says that Runnel county is one hundred percent perfect in the organization for the Seventy-five Million Dollar Campaign. This means that all churches have organized for the campaign, and Runnel county should be included in the list of 100 percent perfect counties which The Ledger published a few days ago. Dr. Swindell is in charge of the work in this county.

ANOTHER NEGRO COMMITTS FORGERY

A negro giving his name as Charlie King is in jail charged with forgery, and has made a confession.

The negro attempted to pass a forged check for \$64 at the First National Bank Saturday morning. The check was made payable to Jim Bell, and signed N. E. Adkinson, and endorsed Jim Bell.

The paying teller at the bank held up the check when it was presented for payment and declared that the signature was not that of N. E. Adkinson.

While an investigation was being made the negro skipped out, but was later caught near the city by Sheriff Perkins, and when brought face to face with the facts in the case admitted that he was the right negro. Employees at the bank also identified him.

Since the grand jury less than a month ago, five criminal cases have been filed here, and most of the parties are in jail. Such crime is the natural consequence of importing a couple of thousand people of all the riffraff class here to help gather the crop.

In signing the check the negro spelled the name "Adkinson" when the name should have been spelled "Atkinson."

Dr. J. W. Blasdel, who has been ill for some time and underwent a serious operation, and who was moved from the sanitarium to his home several days ago, is getting along nicely, we are glad to note.

NEW YORK, Nov. 8.—A nation wide revolutionary plot in the United States, alleged to have been fostered in Russia, has been frustrated by federal agents, according to an announcement made in Washington this afternoon.

A general uprising in this country had been planned to start with a general demonstration to-day, has apparently been averted by a series of raids by the department of justice operatives last night. The raids were carried on by federal agents in nearly a score of cities last night and early today, which resulted in the arrest of more than six hundred men and women.

The revolutionary movement, according to officials is directly charged to a union of Russian workers who are declared to be more radical than the Bolshevik organization in Petrograd. The organization operating in this country is said to have more than seven thousand members.

Quantities of arms and ammunition was seized during the raid.

BETTER SERVICE ON THE SANTA FE

The Santa Fe is now operating its west bound train in two sections. The first section arrives on time, or within a few minutes of schedule time, taking care of local travel, and the second section follows about an hour and a half later, handling through travel, mail and express. By operating the train in two sections the first section takes much of the work off the regular mail train and makes it possible for that train to arrive here before business closes for the day.

Dry goods merchants were busy, notwithstanding that it was a bad day, and many bundles of glad rags were tied out by the sales forces at each store.

White people should learn now that Saturday will be negro day in Ballinger for the remainder of this year, and arrange to do their shopping on some other day in the week.

DENY CHARGES

Local cotton buyers brand as absolutely false the statement carried in Friday's Ledger and credited to Commissioner of Agriculture Davis, in which Mr. Davis claimed that West Texas cotton is being sold at a much lower price than the same grade of cotton is selling for in other sections of the state.

Mr. Davis said that West Texas cotton is being discriminated against by the buyers and he said that middling stain was bringing from \$15 to \$20 per bale more in other sections of the state than middling white was bringing in West Texas.

"Any reasonable thinking man should know that such a statement is false," said a local cotton buyer.

"All the markets are quoted daily in every state paper, and by comparison it can be seen that the market in West Texas is better than the South or Central Texas market," said a local buyer.

The buyers suggested that if stain middling cotton is selling for from \$15 to \$20 per bale more in other parts of the state than middling white is bringing here, Mr. Davis could make good money by coming here and buying a lot of this cotton and shipping it to other points and selling it for the high price he claims.

Long staple cotton at some points in Texas is selling for as high as 55 cents, but there is no such cotton in this country, and the charge made by Mr. Davis is branded as false by local buyers.
