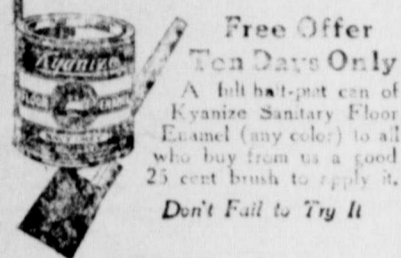

## Oil Report from Runnels and Adjoining Counties

Reports from the Ballinger oil fields and the progress of oil development in Runnels and adjoining counties was compiled by a local oil scout Thursday and furnished The Ledger for publication. This information comes direct

from the various wells in this territory and is reliable.

The Safety First is shut down at 1330 feet, waiting for a new boiler. The flues in the old boiler gave way and repairs will be made in this boiler and the boiler moved to some other well by the drilling contractors where drilling is not so heavy.

Nelson & Nelson are fishing on Mustang. As soon as the lost tools are recovered the boiler and engine at this well, which are new, will be moved to the Safety First well and used in completing that well.

The Runnels County Oil Co. are drilling in their Rowena well at 915 feet, making good time. At present the drill is in gray lime.

Lacy is cleaning out his well on the Russell ranch, preparatory to resuming drilling at once.

Russell No. 3 spudded in last Monday, and is drilling successfully.

Sinclair on the McNay ranch is down 1760 feet and drilling.

### Concho County

Schultz is shut down at 3200 feet, waiting for casing.

The Leonard Petroleum Co. on the Sam Waring ranch near Eden, is shut down at 2910 feet, waiting

for orders. This well may be shot at the present depth.

### Coke County

The Schuhmaker well on the Westbrook ranch near Tenyson, is drilling up underreamer lugs which were lost in the well. This well is 2950 feet deep.

The Cratty Oil Co. is placing derriek timber on the ground for a well on the Fletcher ranch in Coke county.

The Central Oil and Development Co. has the material on the ground for a well on the John Sauls ranch in Coke county.

### Coleman County

The Nancy Oil Co., formerly the Gladys Bell, is shut down at 1503 feet in test feet of oil sand and is waiting for the shooter.

Mitchell Well No. 1 on the J. P. Morris ranch in Coleman county, is producing 12,000,000 feet of gas at 1700 feet.

Jim Ned well is fishing for tools at 2860 feet. When the hole is cleared the drillers will back up to the 2735 foot mark and shoot the well in oil sands at that depth.

The Thomas well on the Dibrell ranch has a good showing of oil at 3102 feet.

The Sims Oil Co. is building a derriek on the Dibrell estate and will spud in the well as soon as a derriek is completed.

### Tom Green County

The San Angelo Oil & Gas Co. on the John Harris ranch, is shut down at 2470 feet.

The Whiteside Oil & Gas Co. on the Willis Johnson Door Key ranch, is drilling up an underreamer which was lost at 2800 feet.

The Sandiego & Texas Oil Co. on the Clegg ranch, struck a salt branch at 2002 feet. The well has shut down and is settling with drillers. The contractors and the company will finish the well themselves.

## BLOOD SHED FEARED OVER OIL WELL

FREDERICK, Okla., Nov. 13.—A battle royal is feared between the claimants to the Burk-Senator oil well in the Red River field south of here.

Officers heavily armed have started to the scene under orders from the court to take possession of the fields. Texas parties who are claiming the well were recently ousted by Oklahoma parties who are holding under court order.

It is feared that there will be bloodshed as the Texans are refusing to give up the well.

## COTTON MAKES GAIN THURSDAY

Cotton regained some of the loss in the big drop of Wednesday, when New York January futures advanced from 35.16 to 35.50 Thursday, gaining 34 points of the 200 loss the day before.

The spot market also came back with a good gain. New York spots gained 75 points of Wednesday's loss and Houston spots gained 150 points.

Buyers were in the game with renewed vim Wednesday and cotton was moving as usual. Seed remains at \$75 per ton on the streets, and several cars are being loaded.

## SHERIFF HIDES THREE DAYS WITH MEN

DALLAS Nov. 13.—After three days of hide and seek with a mob numbering more than one hundred men, Sheriff Hale, of Henderson, arrived here today with I. J. Raspberry and son Ike, who are charged with the murder of Mrs. Dixie Pool and the wounding of Mrs. Pool's husband and Ernest Willard.

Sheriff Hale said that he had been forced to hide in thickets and cornfields with his prisoners to avoid the mob which at several times was within one hundred yards of him. The prisoners have been lodged in jail, and reports received here state that the mob is re-forming to come after the men.

Raspberry and son shot Mrs. Pool, killing her instantly and wounded Pool and Willard as the three were driving the Pool hogs out of the Raspberry field near Henderson last Monday.

**WHY COTTON AND COTTON SEED HIGH**

The following information was gained at the World's Cotton Conference at New Orleans, La.:

English spinners will make arrangements to buy three million bales of American cotton. Indications now are less than a ten million bale crop. English and American spinners have very little cotton on hand. They are making immense fortunes on account of high prices received for their stocks. They could now pay the farmers sixty cents for cotton, based on selling price of cloth. Spinners are excited over the shortage of production. They have millions tied up in equipment and hundreds of thousands of laborers dependent upon them for work and must have cotton. The American farmers have a limited supply of cotton and can and will get forty cents by holding same. It takes twelve months to grow cotton. It should be marketed through a period of twelve months and not forced on the market in three months. This year's crop was produced on war time price basis. And with four successive short crops the world will face a cotton famine next June.

Thousands of tons of cotton seed in Texas on account of incessant rains have sprouted and ruined in the fields. In previous years cotton seed oil mills crushed thousands of tons of peanuts. Today peanuts are selling from \$100 per ton for shelling purposes, and mills cannot buy them for crushing. Therefore cotton seed oil will have no competition with peanut oil. Heretofore thousands of head of hogs have been fattened on cheap peanuts. Peanuts will all be harvested and thus the supply of fats from this source will be curtailed, and cotton seed oil will certainly be demand. There will be practically no peanut meal produced and thus cotton seed meal will have little competition as stock feed. It is one of the best protein feeds on the market and will sell for much higher prices.

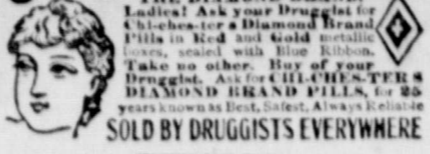
