TOPEKA, Kansas, Dec. 1.—A special train carrying troops and laborers to the Kansas coal fields, was wrecked at Humboldt this morning, according to reports received here this afternoon. Eight coaches in the middle of

the train were derailed when some one threw the switch. It is believed that a plot to wreck the train had been formed, and an investigation is being held.

Aside from a general shaking up and minor bruises, there were no casualties from the wreck.

Kansas City, Mo., Dec. 1.—Fifteen hundred yard men and train men of the Kansas City terminal and railroads entering the city went on strike late yesterday, early reports today indicated.

Day crews left their work at 4 o'clock this afternoon and night crews coming on at that hour did not go to work. Eight roads are affected so far.

Railroad officials after conferring in Kansas City tonight addressed telegrams to governors of Missouri and Kansas, asking them to appeal to the federal government to supply troops, to insure operation of trains during the strike.

STRIKERS RIOTING IN VIRGINIA

WHEELING, W. Va., Dec. 1.—A request for troops has been made for Marshall county, West Virginia, following rioting early this morning between steel strikers and deputy officers.

The trouble grew out of the strikers interfering with returning workers. One man was killed and it is believed that Sheriff Clayton of Marshall county is fatally shot.

ABILENE COTTON OIL MILL BURNS

News of the destruction of the Abilene Cotton Seed Oil mill, by fire was received in Ballinger Sunday. According to reports received here the mill burned early Sunday morning, fire breaking out about three o'clock.

The Abilene mill was one of the best in Texas, and the loss Sunday carried with it a large store house of cotton seed and cotton seed meal and hulls. According to the report received here the entire mill was destroyed, causing a heavy loss to its owners.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 1.—Characterizing as "mere excuses" for Mexico's reasons for not releasing Consul Jenkins, the United States sent another note to the Mexican government today. The note forwarded today again asked for the "immediate release of Jenkins."

Secretary of State Lansing forwarded the note to Mexico City today, and his communication brushed aside the Mexican reply to the first note, and declared that the United States is not to be driven by such subtle argument into defense of its request for the release of Jenkins.

Mr. Lansing stated that it was for Mexico to show cause for the detention of the American consul, and said that "the charges against Jenkins are entirely unsupported by the evidence so far furnished the American government."

The note today made no reference to the killing of Wm. T. Wallace, an American, at Tampico, Wednesday. The two cases are being handled separately, and the government is attempting to settle the Jenkins case before taking up the Wallace case.

A. & S. MOVES ON SCHEDULE TIME

Whether it was a mishap, or whether fulfillment of the promise made by the officials that the service on the A. & S. would be improved, the A. & S. arrived here on time Monday. This is the first time this train has arrived on time since the Fourth of July. From three to eight hours delay has been the rule.

CHANGE IN DUNDEE WOOLEN MILLS

Several days ago V. Weinberg sold his one-half interest in the Dundee Woolen Mills, a local tailoring establishment, to his partner, J. L. Hardin. In turn Mr. Hardin sold a one-third interest in the business to James McKown, and the style of the new firm is Hardin & McKown.

Mr. Weinberg will leave this week for Laredo, where he will be several days on business, and it is probable that he will leave Ballinger.

NEW TRAIN ON ABILENE & SOUTHERN

The A. & S. is operating two trains over its line from Ballinger to Abilene. At least two trains arrived at Ballinger Monday. The regular passenger train arrived and departed on time, and a freight train pulled into the yard here and did the switching and handled the freight.

The officials of the A. & S. promised improved service, and it is presumed that this is the improvement promised, although no announcement has been made of the change.

Traffic has been badly congested over this road for the past two or three months, and the people will welcome this change, although it was expected that the freight train would continue to carry passenger coaches and a passenger train would be added.

B. Y. P. U. TRAINING SCHOOL

D. J. Lacy returned to Ballinger Monday morning on the delayed train, after a visit to Fort Worth and Oklahoma. He is here to look after the drilling at the Lacy well.

Dr. Alvin Swindell announces that a training school in B. Y. P. U. work will begin at the Baptist church tonight. The pastor will conduct the school, and three meetings will be held each week.

Bad weather gives South Texas cotton pickers a home sickness, and they are returning home. However, they are returning home dressed up and with pockets full of money.

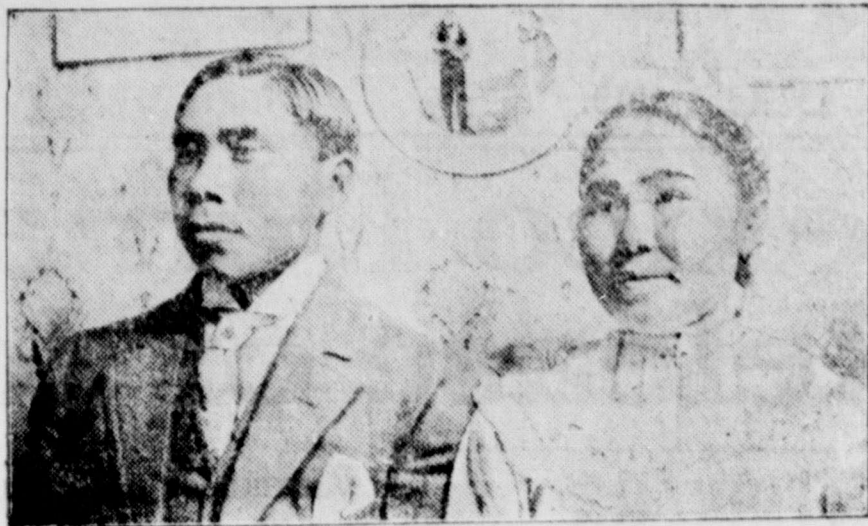
People who plan to eat Christmas dinner with home folks will have to allow for delayed trains and start on the journey several days ahead of time. Railroads are in bad condition.

Church Changes Eskimo Igloo Life Into Modern Home Making



Mr. and Mrs. Oliver Ongoolook.

Art is art, even in Eskimo circles, and "The Angelus" hangs on the wall of Oliver Ongoolook's parlor at Unalakleet, Alaska, where in olden days a smoked salmon probably decorated the icy wall of an igloo. That Oliver and his beaming bride have adopted the more intricate but less cumbersome garments of white civilization is shown in this photograph brought to the States by E. A. McIntosh, a lay missionary speaking in this country in the interests of the nation-wide campaign of the Episcopal church.

Oliver is chief reindeer herder for the United States government at Unalakleet. Unalakleet means "south side" and Mr. McIntosh suggests that it was probably applied to this point of Alaska because it is south of the north pole. There is no other reason apparent.

Chief Herder Ongoolook, who plays the guitar and piano when he is not herding reindeer, can also read and write English. His rise in the scale of civilization shows the beneficial effects of the missions and schools in Alaska. The Episcopal church has 25 missions in the frozen North and the church's nation-wide campaign seeks to extend this work there greatly.

The efforts of the men to provide opportunities for girls such as they have in North America were humorously illustrated by an enterprise undertaken in Brazil. A young President of one of the States of Brazil visited the United States and was greatly impressed with advantages of forced girls here. Like a regular Ad Clubber or Rotarian, he went back to his home city, interested all the other progressive young business men and they built a school for girls. It was elaborately equipped for teaching domestic science, thinking that first of all girls should be trained to be home makers. Courses were announced for "graduate wifehood and motherhood." The school, plenty of money to conduct it, pupils—everything but teachers were found. Again they turned to the United States and got a faculty of young women about 21 years of age to teach wifehood and motherhood. The school is now closed and the "faculty" have sought more suitable vocations.

At Rio Janeiro, a city of 1,000,000 population, she said, were 20,000 employed women and not a building where such a woman might have lunch while every third door is a coffee house for men. "When eating in your scientific cafeterias and in the lurchrooms provided by factories and department stores for women employees, think of the girls of Rio Janeiro, eating a sandwich and a banana wherever they can find a spot to stand or sit."

The one thing the matter with the woman movement in South America," Mrs. Clarke said, "is that it has no self starter.

"If I were free to do so, I should go to South America tomorrow to help do the social and welfare work among girls and women that all classes of women are asking for."

Attending the conference were representative women from Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico. Much interest was manifested in the conditions as described by Mrs. Clarke and the appeal made to extend the work of the Young Women's Christian Association in South America. Members of the Association and other interested women in the Southwest will co-operate with the National Y. W. C. A. in sending Y. W. C. A. secretaries to establish permanent work in new centers in the Southern Continent.

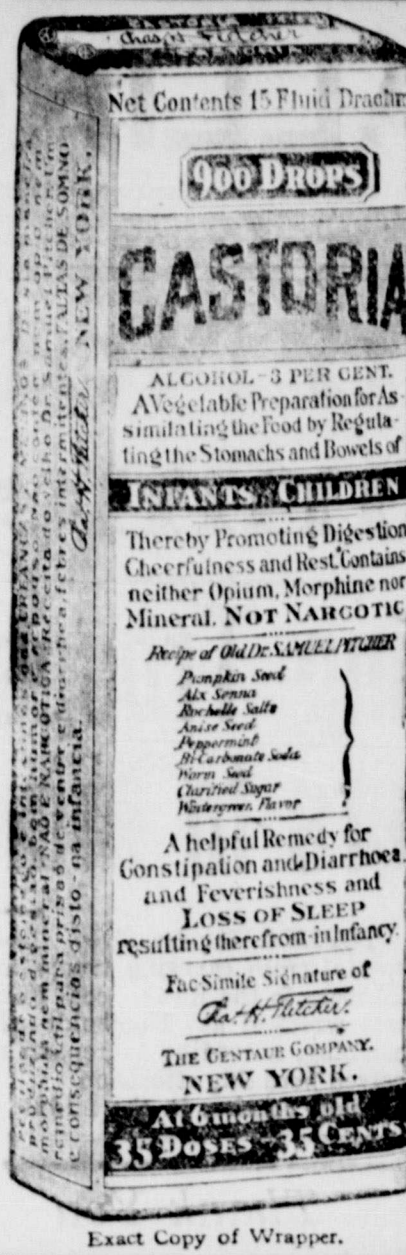

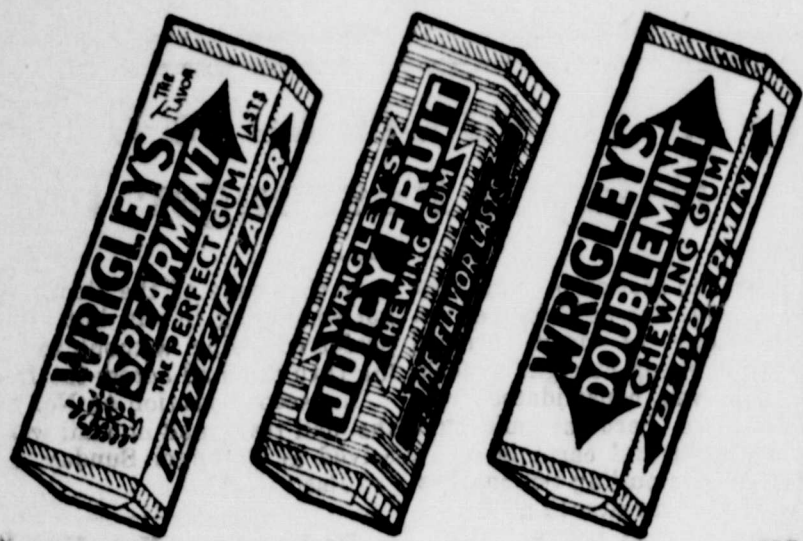

Social Regeneration of Tomorrow Seen Through Social Revolutions of Today

By the RT. REV. CHARLES P. ANDERSON, Bishop of Chicago
and Chairman of the Episcopal Church's Nation-Wide Campaign Commission

SOME socialists say that the church is capitalistic. Some capitalists say that the church is socialistic. All churchmen know that it is neither, but that it furnishes the only environment wherein both can meet in their proper relations to each other and to God.

"O for a few days of sanity," said Secretary Lane when the industrial conference adjourned in failure.

"O for a few days of Christianity," men might well say when everything is being tried except Christianity.

Some say that the church has failed. If so, education has also failed and so has science. No, she has not failed. What has failed has been a sordid and materialistic civilization. It is only through a resurgent faith in the power of Christianity to assert its corporate strength that we can look through the social revolutions of today to the social regeneration of tomorrow.

Let us get a fresh grip on first principles and see whether religion, when taken seriously, is capable of exercising a constructive and stabilizing influence in the chaotic conditions in which men now live.

This is the underlying principle of the nation-wide campaign. The war for democracy has been won. The war for religion and progress is now on. The motto of the nation-wide campaign is: "On to Christ; Forward March!

75 MILLION CAMPAIGN IS NOW ON

The big Baptist campaign for 75 million dollars was put on yesterday all over the South after 5 months of preparation, and the work of solicitation will go on through the week, closing up next Sunday night. Up to 10:30 last night only a few churches had been heard from, according to Rev. Alvin Swindell, organizer for Rumpel county association, but reports were for the most part very encouraging. It is probable that not a great deal was accomplished among the country churches yesterday on account of the impassable condition of the roads. And doubtless much was done that could not be reported because of broken phone lines. In the Ballinger church the results, so far, are highly satisfactory to all the workers. Many local members have not been seen yet, and the non-residents have not been heard from, and it is expected that the total will reach a handsome figure in a few days.

All over the association the work is to be carried even to the last member, and the quota of \$80,000.00 will probably be reached if every one is enlisted.

ORIENT RAILROAD WITHOUT COAL

(San Angelo Standard)

A fuel famine has begun to grip the Kansas City, Mexico and Orient railway of Texas and threatens to cause a suspension of all traffic unless coal is immediately obtained. The supply on hand in San Angelo and at other division points is sufficient for only three or four days.

In order to conserve fuel to the greatest possible extent and still keep trains moving, Superintendent N. J. O'Brien, from his office in his city Saturday ordered a temporary embargo on all freight except livestock feed, food for human consumption and perishable goods. Shipments in transit continued to their destinations.

Mr. O'Brien characterized the situation Saturday night as serious. He stated that relief measures had been greatly handicapped since Thursday owing to the breaking of telegraph and telephone wire by the heavy sleet storm, and it was not definitely known what the federal railway manager was doing to speed up the movement of coal. Any hour it might be possible to lift the temporary embargo or, on the other hand, it might be necessary to further curtail traffic.

While the Orient is facing a serious problem, towns along the 477 miles of track from Alpine to the Red river are also in a predicament. With few exceptions, all are without wood or coal and the majority are dependent solely on the Orient for their fuel supply. San Angelo is in the class first mentioned.

A few cars of wood reached the city Saturday from Central Texas, but the supply will effect but little relief at a time when hundreds of cords of wood and coal by the scores of tons are needed.

Washington, Nov. 29-19. A. W. Sledge, Ballinger, Texas, answering your appeal and numerous calls for coal from my district, can promise no definite assurance of immediate relief. Am doing everything possible. Administration is swamped with emergency appeals from every direction. I have just visited the coal fields where the miners are furnished brick residences, steam heated, electric lighted, flowing water, gardens, special schools and church advantages, free theater twice a week, with wages ranging from \$150 to \$325 per month. Republic is now fighting dangerous international enemies who are seeking nothing less than destruction of government itself. We are not sorely experiencing results of anarchistic labor leadership against which I have been warning and preaching for many

months. Most of the 300 strikes now waging are not legitimate efforts to better working conditions but part of a soviet conspiracy dominated by Europe and bolshevistic influence to disrupt our government under circumstances. Ask our people to patiently bear present hardship.

SELECTING 300 CENSUS TAKERS

Supervisor of Census A. W. Sledge is selecting from many applications, enumerators to take the census in nineteen counties comprising the Seventeenth District of Texas.

A sufficient number of applicants have qualified from several counties in the district, while the number is far short in several counties, especially in Eastland and Stephens counties.

It will require about three hundred enumerators to take the census in this district, unless some of the enumerators are reappointed to work in other districts after they have completed the work in the district for which they are first assigned, and this will be done in the smaller enumeration districts.

After repeated appeals for an increase in rate of pay, the Director of Census has authorized that the maximum rate be paid in most of the counties in this district, and in some enumeration districts the pay will be by the day.

Only three enumerators have been appointed in Rumpel county. One is for the city of Miles, and one for the Miles rural precinct. Rev. J. B. Curry has volunteered to do the work in Ballinger. A dozen enumerators are needed in the rural districts of this county, and parties should apply for the work at once, as the time is short in which to qualify and be supplied with the necessary supplies for doing the work.

Mr. Sledge stated that up to noon Monday about one hundred appointments had been made.

Takes Three Crews to Get Delayed Passenger Through

The second section of passenger train No. 77, due at Ballinger at 12:26 Sunday at noon, arrived Monday morning at eight o'clock. The train was consolidated with the train due here at midnight Sunday night and came in as a double header pulling ten coaches.

The delay was due to a derailment on the road between Coleman and Coleman Junction, when all the drive wheels of the locomotive left the track.

A wrecking crew was put on the job and it was nine o'clock Sunday night when the big engine was ready to roll again, and by that time the sixteen hour law had caught the crew, and they pulled into the junction and tied up until another crew could arrive to relieve them.

A freight crew, which had already been out for some time, came along and relieved the passenger crew, but before moving very far the sixteen hour law caught them, and the passenger train again stopped until another crew could arrive. The third crew was sent to the train and was carrying it thru at the above hour.

It was a weary lot of passengers who got off at Ballinger, and practically all of them, about one hundred got off. They had been without anything to eat since eleven o'clock Sunday, and having to sit up all night in the coaches they were badly "done up."
