WILSON OPPOSES BREAK CARRANZA GOVERNMENT

COAL SLPPLY PUT UNDER LEVER ACT

WASHINGTON, Dec 8 .- President Wilson is deeply concerned in the relationship existing between Mexico and the United States. Mr. Wilson declared today that he would be "gravely concerned" to see the Falls resolution asking for the severance of diplomatic relations with Mexico, adopted, or any resolution like it.

Immediately following the receipt of the president's communication, Senator Lodge announced that the Falls resolution was dead and would not be revived in the foreign relations committee.

President Wilson declared that the passage of such a resolution would constitute a reversal of our constitutional practice, which might lead to grave confusion in ertising regard to guidance in our foreign
