JUDGE SPENCE DIES FROM INJURIES

Judge Joseph Spence died at five o'clock at his home in San Angelo, Saturday morning, from injury sustained early Friday night. Relatives in Ballinger will go to San Angelo Sunday to attend the funeral.

Judge Joseph Spence was seriously hurt and in a mysterious way, Friday night, according to information received from San Angelo. Dr. W. B. Halley was called to that city to attend the unfortunate man and went up on the midnight train which passed thru Ballinger at four o'clock Saturday morning.

According to information received in Ballinger shortly after the tragedy and later Saturday morning, Judge Spence had returned from Sonora, where he had been to attend court. The auto in which he returned in stopped in front of the St. Angelus Hotel, and Judge Spence had started home, walking, stating to others who returned from Sonora with him that he would walk home.

A few minutes later some one rushed into the hotel and reported that a dead man was lying on the street near the hotel. The man proved to be Judge Spence. He was carried to the hotel and later removed to his home, and up to the last reports he was still unconscious.

Just how the man was hurt remains a mystery and will prob-

ably not be known until he regains consciousness. Bruises on the face and back of the head indicate that the man was attacked and sandbagged, while it has been suggested that a speeding car might have struck him and the driver refused to stop and offer aid.

Judge Spence is well known in Ballinger, having frequently visited here. About two years ago he married Mrs. Clara Ransome in this city. Mrs. Ransome is a sister of Messrs. J. McGregor and Jno. I. Guion.

TWO COMMUNITY SERVICES TOMORROW

While the strike has been settled in the coal mines the fuel situation in this country is approaching the crisis. The next few days will determine whether the people must rely on wood, if they can get it, or whether coal will be moving this way in time to prevent suffering.

So far the local churches are the only institutions to make a concerted effort to conserve fuel. All of the churches have some coal, but none of the churches have a sufficient supply to carry them thru the winter, and some are practically without coal.

In order that the people might worship in comfort, and at the same time consume as little coal as possible, the pastors of the respective churches have agreed upon a plan of community services. There will only be two and perhaps one service on Sunday night for the next month or two.

Tomorrow night there will be two services. Rev. J. B. Curry, pastor of the Methodist church, will preach at the Baptist church, and Rev. Geo. E. Beatty, pastor of the Christian church, will preach at the Eighth Street Presbyterian church. No doubt the attendance at both services will be large.

COURT HOLDS WOMEN CAN USE VOTE

AUSTIN, Dec. 13.—The constitutionality of the woman suffrage law, which gives women the right to participate in primary elections, was upheld by the Third Court of Civil Appeals, today, when the court unanimously affirmed the McClennan county court decision refusing to perpetuate an injunction against Tax Collector Davis which would have restrained the collector from issuing poll tax receipts to women. All women who pay their poll taxes will be permitted to vote in the primary election, but the poll tax is made necessary to qualify for voting just the same as it is for men.

PRESENT BLIZZARD TO BE SHORT LIVED

The weather man promises a better class of weather for tonight and tomorrow. The forecast says, "Tonight fair, rising temperature; Sunday rising temperature."

The temperature tumbled again Friday night, and registered fourteen degrees above zero at sunup. This is the third freeze up for the week just closing, the temperature dropping to 12 degrees Tuesday and Wednesday mornings.

The freeze slipping up on the people after they had retired caught many without water supply, the pipes freezing before the water was cut off, and the plumber will have his day.

The fuel situation grows hourly more serious here, as the supply is rapidly diminishing and dealers are unable to get wood. Individuals are using telegraph wires in an effort to start wood moving this way.

MEXICANS HOLDING MEN FOR RANSOM

EAGLE PASS, Dec. 13.—Eight Mexicans and two Americans and one Englishman are reported to be held for ransom by the Villistas who captured Muzquiz Tuesday, and took a number of civilians prisoners.

The Mexicans are being held for \$5,000 ransom and the Americans \$10,000. The Englishman is reported to have been released. The Villistas retreated toward Chihuahua yesterday with their prisoners.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—A

report to the state department yesterday said that no Americans were harmed during the capture of Muzquiz by the Villistas. This report was given out after it had been reported that Americans were being held for ransom.

GIRLS FACE COLD TO PLAY TAG

Despite the freezing cold weather a bevy of young ladies pinned many tags Saturday afternoon, and several hundred dollars was added to the soldier tubercular sanitarium fund.

Dollar tags were in demand and there was little demand for two-bit tags. The big red dollar tags fluttered in the breezes from the lapels of many coats and overcoats.

The chairman of the work placed orders with the printers for 250 dollar tags Friday, and one thousand two-bit tags. By noon Saturday it was necessary to increase the order for dollar tags.

No report has been received here from Winter, and Miles where tag day is also being held to raise money for the tubercular sanitarium fund, but it is expected that those towns will come up liberally.

The young ladies who played tag with the folks on the streets and in the business houses, soon found that two-bit tags would not go, and they called on Chairman Kirk for more dollar tags.

One young lady reported more than one hundred dollars by early afternoon and was still having fun playing tag.

Rural schools are contributing to the fund and the county will go over the top.

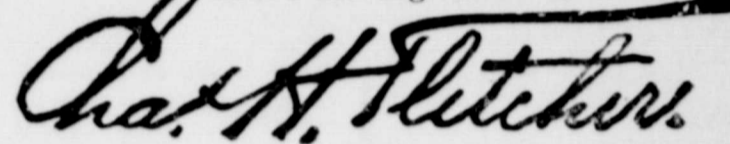
