WASHINGTON, Jan. 24. With a majority of the medical profession opposed to the pres eription of whishey for the relief of bodily ills, it will take the country a generation or more to consume the 74,000,000 gallons of spirits now stored in bonded

warehouses. This is the opinion of Internal Revenue Commissioner Roper, ex pressed in the course of a letter to Chairman Fordney of the House Committee on Ways and Meaus, outlining a plan for the government to take over and distribute for medicinal purposes this vast supply of liquor.

If the liquor is left in the present warehouses, Roper thought, it would be necessary to employ 2,500 additional guards to prevent thefts, at a cost of \$\$3,000,000 to \$4,000,000 a year.
