WILSON SAYS U. S. MUST FEED HUNGRY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—President Wilson today requested secretary Glass to renew his appeal to congress for an appropriation of one hundred and fifty million dollars for a relief fund to help the starving population of Poland and Austria, and Armenia. The president said that continued appeals came to him that thousands of helpless people on the bolshevik front were starving to death, and with a store house of plenty it was the duty of the American government to offer aid.

CHICAGO, Jan. 29.—The freighter "Neff" which was caught in an ice avalanche and held ice bound on the lake for nearly a week arrived safely today, and docked at the municipal pier. The crew suffered great hardships, and had a narrow escape from death.

OIL WELL REPORTS ARE CONFLICTING

"We will complete Russell No. 3 this week," said E. M. Eubanks Wednesday morning, "unless we have trouble and get a fishing job on hand." When asked what he had in Russell No. 3 Mr. Eubanks said "nothing" and he stated further that neither oil or gas had been found in the well.

"There is not enough oil in that well to grease a gimblet," said Mr. Eubanks, "and the gas supply is so small it can hardly be detected."

Continuing Mr. Eubanks said that the drilling of Russell No. 3 had only served one purpose and that was to prove that the field extended south from Russell No. 1, which was the best well of the three.

Mr. Eubanks said he did not know what the next move of the Gulf Production Co., would be, and orders for the present were to suspend operations. The well is down about 2500 feet, while the best oil showing in No. 1 was found around 2300 feet.

The report given by Mr. Eubanks who is in the employ of the company which is drilling the well is conflicting with other reports received from the well through different sources. The Ledger must rely on reports received from drillers and from scouts for its information and report the progress of the development from such information, and we desire to give nothing but the straight "dope."

WOODWARD ASK TO REMAIN ON BENCH

Judge J. O. Woodward, whose illness last week made it necessary for the local bar to appoint Judge I. J. Rice as temporary justice of the 35th judicial district has sufficiently recovered to enable him to come to Brownwood from his home at Coleman and attend today to the final business of the term preparatory to adjournment. He will return to Coleman tomorrow morning, and any unfinished business before the court will be heard by Judge Rice before formal adjournment of the court.

Judge Woodward in response to an inquiry this morning, told the Bulletin that he will be a candidate for re-election this year, but due to the fact that no opponent is expected in the race he will forego the formality of a campaign.—Brownwood Bulletin.

300,000 PEOPLE SICK ALL THE TIME

AUSTIN, Jan. 28.—Over three hundred thousand people in the United States are seriously ill all the time, health experts have estimated. This means, since most of the illness is of less than a year's duration, that there are many more than 300,000 ill within a year, declares the Texas Public Health Association.

"Over one-half the illness in the United States is preventable," stated D. E. Breed, executive secretary of the Association. The prevention of disease will prevent pain, suffering, and loss of earnings also.

If 200,000 of those people who are ill were of working age and earned only three dollars a day, \$600,000 per day of \$219,000,000 a year would be saved economically to the country, were disease prevented among them. At the cost of only two dollars a day for nursing, medical attendance and medicine, the actual cost of illness would be \$146,000,000—a total monetary loss of \$365,000,000 yearly.

Through field workers—public health nurse, directors of children's work, field secretary, Mexican secretary, negro lecturer and others—the Texas Public Health Association is trying to bring the knowledge of prevention to the people of the Lone Star State. It is teaching children and their elders the way in which to keep healthy and strong in order to ward off disease.

Eleven alleged I. W. W.'s are on trial charged with murder in connection with the shooting to death of four ex-service men at Centrlia, Washington, last November, during an armistice parade.

The defendants pleaded that sentiment in Graysharbor county where the trouble occurred, is so strong against them that they can not get a fair trial.

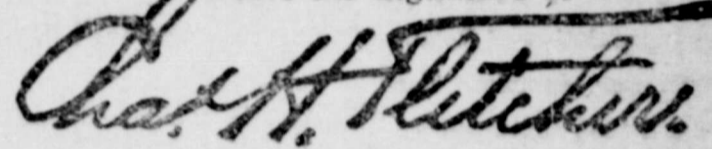

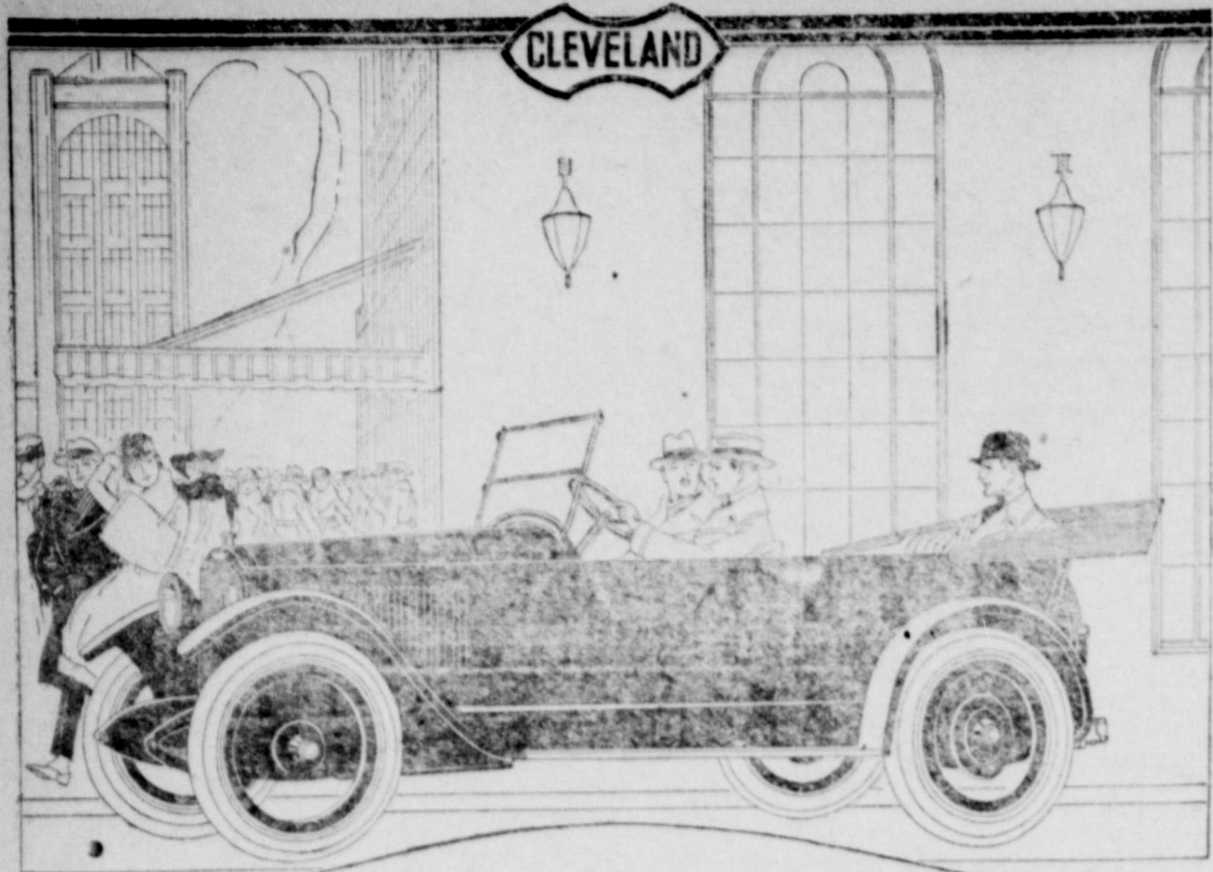

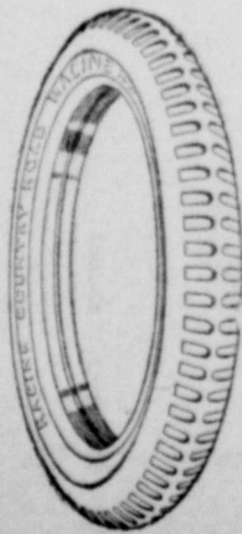
