

Thrift in Chile.

The Scots and the French had better look to their laurels as saving peoples. Chile bids fair to rival them. During the last ten years savings institutions have risen considerably in number. In 1910 there existed in the entire country but a dozen independent institutions carrying the accounts of some 200,000 persons; their complete savings amounted to only \$4,-000,000 in American money. In 1917 deposits rose to 110,000,000 Chilean pesos, which would equal about onefourth as many American dollars. To this, in the year 1918, were added 50,-600,000 more Chilean pesos. The nation has encouraged savings, through stamps and other substantial inducements. Incidentally it is worth while noting that lotteries are not permitted in Chile; down there they believe in getting rich slowly and surely.






