## PALMER TO DEMAND THAT SUGAR PRICES COME DOWN

WASHINGTON, April 24.—Attorney General Palmer today announced plans for giving "straight to the shoulder" communication to the sugar refiners, who will be called to meet here next Monday, a warning of what is to come if the price of sugar is not reduced.

Mr. Palmer will demand that the refiners keep the price of sugar down or give a good reason for advancing the price. Department of justice agents are busy investigating the report that the sugar supply has been cornered by speculators and the prices run up to such a point as to make the speculators guilty of profiteering.

For eight or ten years The Ledger has been a member of the United Press, but for a greater part of that time and for the last several years we have been carrying only a bulletin service, which has proven satisfactory as far as it goes.

It was for the purpose of giving more domestic—state and National news, that we make the change and transfer our membership from the United Press to the Associated Press. The United Press can not be excelled for foreign news, but the Associated Press is the best and largest organization in the United States. During the period of time that The Ledger has been taking the United Press, news of Europe was of utmost importance—but now the story is different—and news of America (and South America, where the Associated Press has affiliations and leased cables) is transcendent.

The Ledger will receive three filings each day, while heretofore Brownwood Friday afternoon to all of our telegraph news has been received in one filing. We will also receive extra filings on news of unusual importance and when important news breaks be-

fore or after the regular hours for filing the service which The Ledger will receive daily.

The Associated Press in accepting a member from a town as small as Ballinger is something we justly feel proud of. We make the statement without fear of contradiction, that there is not another town on the map as small as Ballinger with a daily paper carrying the telegraph service which The Ledger has just contracted for.

In addition to this complete pony telegraph service, which will be five times as much telegraph news as we have been carrying, The Ledger will maintain its stand in giving local news, and our local columns will be kept up to standard.

### SUFFRAGE EYES TURN TOWARD LOUISIANA

NEW ORLEANS, La., April 24.—The battle for woman suffrage and to ratify the constitutional amendment in time for women to vote in the presidential election was squarely up to Louisiana today. The fight promises to overshadow all issues before the general assembly when that body convenes, May 10.

Both sides are already in training and leaders predicted that the chances, from present indications of ratifying or defeating the measure were practically on a 50-50 basis.

The situation in New Orleans, where Mayor Behrman opposed suffrage in 1918, will be reversed, it is believed. Behrman has

changed his views and has come out for the amendment, declaring that he will not stand in the way of Louisiana's ratifying.

"Should woman's suffrage need the vote of Louisiana for its adoption as an amendment to the constitution of the United States, I will cheerfully aid in its adoption," Behrman said.

John M. Parker, the incoming governor, is pledged to suffrage. He declared for it on the stump and in his public statements.

Hewitt Bouanchaud, the new lieutenant governor, who will preside over the senate, is credited with being opposed to federal suffrage. Several leading figures in both houses are also opposed to the federal amendment.

**HISTORY REPEATS ITSELF WITH RAIN**

The Underwood News Co. put out some good "dope" Saturday, when D. C. Underwood asked to mind a guilty washing rain which fell in Ballinger thirty-two years ago today.

"I remember it very well," said Mr. Underwood, "when the clouds rolled up from the West and the rain fell in torrents, frightening the people out of the flat."

Mr. Underwood stated that the people in the low land, of the city became uneasy for fear of high water and moved to the hill. "That was on the night of April 24, 1882," said Mr. Underwood, "and on April 25th a fake telegram was posted stating that a 25 foot rise was coming down the Colorado river, and the people remained on the hill another night."

Mr. Underwood is authority on such matters, and he verified his record this time by saying that it was on the day W. E. Kerr, a dry goods man of this city at that time got married, and to make sure he was right he went to the court house to get the date of the marriage license issued to Mr. Kerr.

**LABOR SHORTAGE CUTS FOOD SUPPLY**

WASHINGTON, April 24.—A shortage of farm labor which will be as acute as that of 1918 threatens to curtail food production on American farms. Secretary of Agriculture Meredith said today in appealing to the business men and college students, to spend their vacations working on farms, particularly helping in the harvest fields. He said the supply of farm labor is seventy-two per cent of normal compared with eighty-four per cent last year.

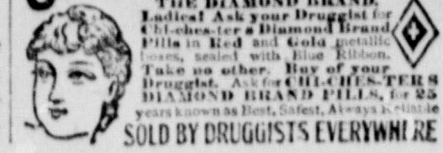

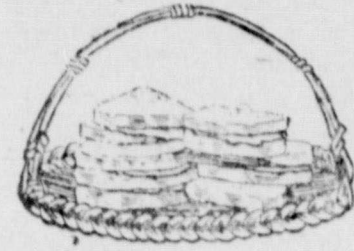

**ADVERTISING WEST TEXAS IN AIRSHIPS**

STAMFORD, Tex., April 24.—Two airplanes and a monster motor truck, carrying a complement of expert publicity and exhibits men, numerous reels of moving pictures depicting West Texas towns and counties, and exhibits from all counties desiring to participate, will leave Stamford about June 1 for a tour of all Eastern, Northern and Southern states, lasting until about October 1. The advertising campaign, unique in the annals of town and county advertising, is being conducted by the West Texas Chamber of Commerce.

The project, which will entail an expenditure of approximately \$40,000, will be made possible by town and county subscriptions. If every West Texas town and county aids the movement the expense will be infinitesimal to each participant.

Tons of literature descriptive of counties represented will be carried on the planes and dropped over small towns, farming communities, large cities and distributed in cities at which the planes will stop. The truck will carry agricultural, mineral and other exhibits. Many reels of moving pictures will be shown at both large and small towns, in theatres and elsewhere. West Texas will be advertised thoroughly, and with the literature to be prepared, interest in the West will be stimulated and a volume of new immigration will set in.

All towns and counties in West Texas interested in the project should immediately take up their wishes with the organization's headquarters at Stamford.

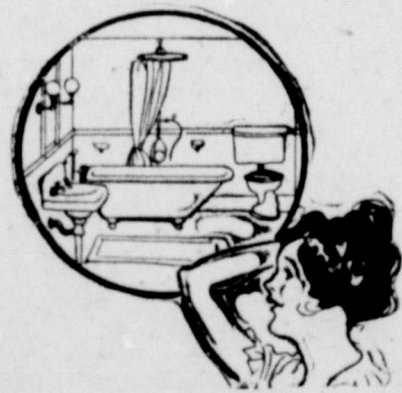
