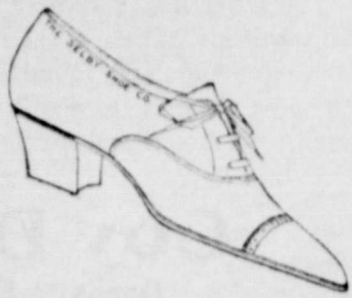

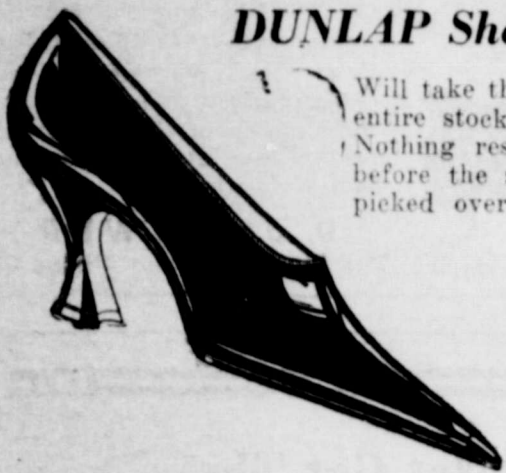

STATE MILITIA SENT TO GALVESTON TO END STRIKE

AUSTIN, June 3.—Governor Hobby decided today to take charge of the Galveston strike situation next Saturday morning at nine o'clock, with Brigadier General J. F. Walters in command, it was announced in a communication to Adjutant General Cope.

AUSTIN, June 3.—Units of the Texas National Guards are being mobilized in several cities today for possible guard duty at Galveston in connection with the strike of the longshoremen at that port.

Mobilization of the militia comes following a warning issued last night by Governor Hobby to the city and county officials of Galveston that the state would assume control of the strike situation Saturday morning, unless traffic congestion is ameliorated by that time.

No serious clashes have been reported, but Governor Hobby declared that freight delays incident to the strike have become serious. The governor said in his statement that workmen must be given full protection, and those who wish to work will be protected from harm by the strikers. The strike has been on for several weeks, and important freight shipments are tied up in Galveston and cannot be delivered by the railroads.

GALVESTON, June 3.—There are no changes in the dock workers strike situation since Governor Hobby's announcement that he would assume control in shipping circles Saturday, unless conditions improved.

WILSON WILL NOT CALL EXTRA CONGRESS

WASHINGTON, June 3.—President Wilson assured the senate democrats today, that if the present session of congress ended Saturday as agreed upon, he would not call an extra session during the summer, unless for some grave emergency.

WASHINGTON, June 3.—The efforts of Senator Kenyon, republican, to amend the House adjournment resolution in the senate today to provide adjournment for July 12th instead of June 5th, failed.

WASHINGTON, June 3.—The senate adopted the House adjournment resolution today, providing for adjournment of congress on June 5th.

WASHINGTON, June 3.—The bill providing for an increase in pay for postal employees passed the House today by a unanimous vote with 343 members present.

WASHINGTON, June 3.—The Senate was asked today by Senator Pomerene, democrat from Ohio, to authorize the committee now investigating the pre-convention political financing, to extend its inquiries to presidential and senatorial campaigns which will end with the November election.

DREADNAUGHT TENNESSEE GOES IN COMMISSION

NEW YORK, June 3.—The super dreadnaught Tennessee, the largest and most formidable battle ship afloat, goes into commission today at the Brooklyn navy yards.

The Tennessee cost twenty million dollars. It is six hundred and twenty feet long with a nine hundred and eighty foot beam, and 32,500 ton displacement.

The special feature of the big battleship is its "fighting brain" which is enclosed in a steel fort near the top forward mast. Concentrated in the fort are devices for observing enemy ships at a great distance.

HOBBY RECOMMENDS SCHOOL APPROPRIATION

AUSTIN, June 3.—In a special message to the legislature today, Governor Hobby recommended that \$5,000,000 be made available for public schools, same to be distributed in the same manner as the present available school fund. Mr. Hobby also recommended an emergency appropriation of \$958,859 for the higher educational institutions.

"The program," said Governor Hobby, "I urge upon you does not include making appropriations for buildings, improvements of a permanent nature, which in my judgment may be attended to without material loss in efficiency by the thirty-seventh legislature. However, to insure teachers for the next scholastic term and to maintain our school system and to provide education for all children of the people of Texas, it is necessary to meet the responsibility of the hour."

AUSTIN, June 3.—The committee appointed to investigate the pink boll worm in the alleged infested districts, made a report today, recommending the passage of the Walters-Cureton bill which proposes to regulate the zones in the infested area.

TROOPS SENT OUT TO GET VILLA LEADERS

EL PASO, June 3.—Col. Claudio Fox, commander at Juarez, announced today that ten thousand soldiers have been ordered from Mexico City to the states of Durango and Chihuahua to begin a campaign against General Villa and Carlos Osuna.

Osuna was formally a General in Carranza's army and he has joined Villa with a force of from 1000 to 1500 men, it is officially announced. Villa has refused to accept the new government and is waging a revolution against it, calling to his support all those who were followers of the Carranza government.

CHICAGO, June 3.—Senator Warren G. Harding and Senator Hiram Johnson, candidates for presidential nomination on the republican ticket, arrived in Chicago today, marking the beginning of the active days of the pre-convention period. Five days remain before the republican party will assemble to pick a candidate to make the race for president. Every candidate except Herbert Hoover is expected to be present at some time during the convention, and some of the candidates will be present until the convention adjourns. An advance guard of delegates began to arrive today.

The team left Ballinger about one o'clock Wednesday afternoon and was accompanied to San Angelo by fourteen cars and about seventy local fans. The boys report that interest in the game on the part of San Angelo seemed to be lacking as there were as many Ballinger fans present as San Angelo rooters.

The game was a good one, as evidenced by the score and while the locals had to use several substitute players, they put over their work in good shape, and maintain a perfect record, which they declare they are going to battle for throughout the season.

The feature of the game comes from the pitcher's box, where Marion Flynt pitched his fourth game of baseball, and held the San Angeliotes down to two hits, and won his fourth game. Barring by Minor McVay, a former Ballinger boy, but now of Eden, and who played with the Ballinger team in the Angelo game, was

also a feature of the game.

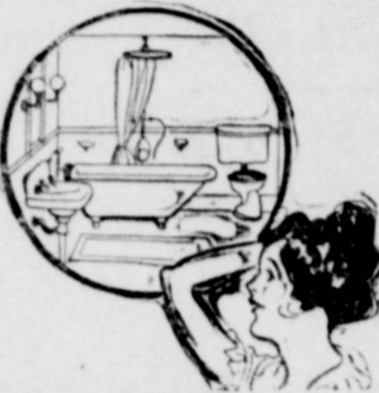

LOCAL HIDE MARKET CLOSED TEMPORARILY

I. O. Wooden, for many years local dealer in hides, announces that he will buy no more hides until further notice. There is no market for hides, and the local dealer advises people who have hides to take care of them until the market improves.

Mr. Wooden says that people should not throw their hides out on the fence and leave them to go to decay or be destroyed by the bugs, and suggests proper ways

to keep them.

"The country needs the hides and there will be a better market later," said Mr. Wooden, "and it is no trouble to preserve hides."

Briefly, Mr. Wooden says the way to take care of hides is to salt it as soon as it is removed from the animal. "Spread the hide out with the green side up," said Mr. Wooden, "and cover the entire hide with salt. Then fold it with flesh side in and root it up. Tie it with a string or bailing wire and place it in a cool place and let it stay there until you can sell it."

The hide, wool and cotton markets are all in the same shape. In fact the market has gone to the bad to where the sellers who turn loose must do so at a great sacrifice. No one seems to be able to explain why there is no market for the essential products. The finish products still hold to the high point, especially shoes, and just why shoes are so high when hides cannot be sold, is a question no one seems to be able to answer to our satisfaction.

CUTTING THE COST OF FEEDING FAMILY

AUSTIN, June 3.—Young women students in the home economics department at the University of Texas are learning how to cut the cost of feeding a family. At the beginning the prime thing is to get a meal, but toward the finish of the course the young woman has also to turn out the finished product cheap. The university expects its young

experts to cut about half off the cost of a lunch by switching desserts and leaving off biscuits. Here is a sample of its before and after college menus:

For 45 cents a plate for four persons: strawberries and mashed

potatoes, iced tea, tomato salad, biscuit, salmon croquettes, and ice cream.

For 24 cents a plate for four persons (toward the end of the course): creamed tuna fish on toast, French fried potatoes, apple and celery salad, hot tea, lemon pie.
