PRO TO FIGHT FOR ENFORCEMENT ACT

WASHINGTON, June 16.—Prohibition advocates will ask the Democratic national convention to adopt a plank declaring for a rigid enforcement of the 18th Amendment, and enforcement of the prohibition laws.

"We will present a solid front against Gov. Cox of Ohio," said Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel for the Anti-Saloon League today, in a formal statement.

3 NEGROES LYNCHED IN MINNESOTA

DULUTH, Minn., June 16.—Virtually normal conditions prevail here this morning, where a mob of five thousand people last night swept the police and other peace officers from power and lynched three negroes. The blacks were being held in the local jail here last night when the big mob stormed the place and carried them away to their death.

A white girl, attacked on circus grounds yesterday by the negroes, caused the inciting of the mob. The negroes lynched were connected with the circus, working as roustabouts.

DEAD LINE NEAR FOR CANDIDATES

All candidates who wish to share in the vote getting on the Democratic primary, must file their names with formal application for a place on the ticket with the County Democratic Executive Committee not later than twelve o'clock Saturday night, June 19. Thus only three days remain in which candidates must qualify for the fracas.

We understand that there are prospective candidates debating between two opinions, and may come in before the entries are closed. In this day of the high cost of living, the compensation offered to public servants is no temptation to the politically inclined, and office seekers are not so plentiful as in the good old days, when such positions put up a reasonable good living for a man. Then too, it is expensive to run for office. The candidates in the primary must face the bill of holding election and that figures all the way from five to ten and fifteen per cent off the salary.

The county executive committee will meet Monday to line-up the ticket. Candidates will be allotted to places on the ticket, and the total cost of holding the election will be computed, and assessments made against the candidates for footing the bill. We understand that in some cases candidates will have to dig up as much as \$200 and probably \$250.

The executive committee will also determine whether there shall be a second primary. The candidates are divided on this question some favoring the second try out and others opposing it. All the candidates without opposition are of course opposed to a second election, as they will have to help foot the bill. There will only be one or two officers interested in the second vote as a majority will be cast for some one candidate in the first primary.

CHARGES DELEGATES DESERTED

LINCOLN, Neb., June 16.—Frank A. Harrison, manager of the Hiram Johnson campaign in the Nebraska presidential primary, issued a statement today charging that "treachery and desertion of delegates from instructed states broke the heart of the Johnson movement."

"Just two men in the Nebraska delegation at all times tried to obey instructions of Nebraska voters when the roll was called. If the Hiram W. Johnson men and women of Nebraska, who voted for him ever forget or forgive the performance of the Nebraska delegation at Chicago, it will be after the accursed convention system is wiped out and forgotten."

PROBING PLANS FOR MOVING S. SCHOOL

AUSTIN, June 16.—The Senate today adopted the Tillotson resolution providing for the appointment of a committee to report by January first upon the advisability of removing the medical department of the Texas University from Galveston.

A resolution providing for an investigation of the cement industry in Texas, was also adopted at the morning session. The House passed the bill proposing to increase salaries of county school superintendents from \$1,000 to \$1,600, to \$2,800 per annum.

WORKERS MEETING HELD AT WINTERS

Perhaps the most successful Workers' Conference held in many a day was held at Winters Tuesday, under the auspices of the Rumpels county Baptist Association, as reported by Rev. Alvin Swinell of this city.

Practically all the twenty-two churches were heard from one way or another. About a dozen persons attended from Ballinger. The body voted to have such meetings on the first Tuesday of every month. The meeting next month will be at Bronte.

GRAIN HARVEST IS WELL UNDER WAY

While the grain crop is far short of the crop of last year, due to the fact that the acreage was light, there will be considerable grain threshed throughout the county.

Threshers began operation this week, and are making good headway with the favorable weather prevailing. Farmers have the farm labor situation pretty well under control, the weather for the past two weeks being favorable for killing weeds and grass, and farm hands operating on full time.

In some sections of the county crops are beginning to show need of rain, and farmers are holding up weeding out cotton to a stand until it rains. Cotton chopping comes high, and the farmer is playing the game safe, and not investing money in unnecessary labor, taking chances on getting his cotton chopped after another good season comes.

The country as a whole is in good shape, and with rain within the next week or ten days, the prospects will show wonderful improvement for the largest cotton crop raised here in several years.

UNION LABOR MEN IMPEACH HOBBS

HOUSTON, June 16.—An impartial investigation of the strike and martial law situation in Galveston by a committee from the Legislature, and not by a military court, or a special representative from the Governor's office, is desired by the Houston labor council.

"Should such an investigation show that troops were called to Galveston to assist one faction against another, organized labor will ask that impeachment proceedings against the Governor be instituted at once," declared W. E. Carroll, secretary of the union labor council this afternoon.

HEALTH OFFICER ISSUES SUMMERTIME WARNING

AUSTIN, June 16.—With the advent of warm weather and flies typhoid is beginning to exact a toll in Texas, according to reports reaching the State Board of Health, and Dr. C. W. Goldard, state health officer, issued a warning today to every community to keep a careful watch upon the purity of its water supply and to properly dispose of all human excreta in a safe manner.

He issued the following statement:

"Keep under surveillance every infected person or carrier, and people in rural communities should provide safe methods of night soil disposal. Typhoid infection is spread through human filth improperly disposed of. It is sometimes carried by storm water to truck and fruit patches and yards where children play."

"It can be carried for long distances by underground seepage to water supplies. It can be scattered by the feet of persons, dogs, cats, rats and other animals. It can be carried direct to food of persons by flies."

"Contaminated water, if used for washing milk vessels or other food containers, may carry the infection to the food. Oysters or other shell fish grown in contaminated water may carry the infection."

FEDERATION SPLIT OVER PLUMB PLAN

MONTREAL, Canada, June 16.—Profiteering, the League of Nations, non-partisan politics, and industrial courts, were given right of way in the American Federation of Labor convention here today. Emphatic action against the high cost of living is promised before the day ends.

It was learned that the "Plumb plan" of nationalization of railroads had been rejected by the resolution committee, but railroad unions immediately combined to override the committee report. The mine workers' president announces that the miners union will support the Plumb plan with the largest vote in the convention, and the Plumb plan supporters say endorsement of the measure will carry.

The convention instructed affiliated associations to "refrain from giving moral or financial support or assistance of any kind to any secessionist movement," and any organization violating the instructions of the convention is threatened to have its charter revoked. The resolution declared that "the secessionist movement is being encouraged by Illinois manufacturers associations and other unfriendly employers of labor for the purpose of discrediting recognized organizations in the railway service."

FAMOUS OLD SALOON BAR MADE A LUNCH COUNTER

BISHOP, Calif., June 16.—The magnificent bar of the Northern Saloon of Goldfield, Nevada, a famous resort of the early gold days there, is now doing service as a lunch counter at Krough Hot Springs, a summer resort of Inyo county.

The bar was built to order in Michigan in 1904 at a cost of over \$3,000. At present prices, the plate glass alone, which totals more than 150 square feet, would cost that sum.

The bar is said to have been sold at junk prices.

TICK ERADICATION LAW IS RESTORED

The tick eradication law, which sustained a heavy blow by a recent ruling of the court, has been restored in good order, and the work of eradicating cattle ticks in Texas will go right along as though nothing had been done to try to defeat the law.

The Ledger received a letter from Representative Stephens Wednesday, in which Mr. Stephens said: "The tick eradication law has been restored by the House, accepting the Senate amendment to House bill No. 64 this afternoon by a vote of 99 to 7, the bill receiving the necessary 95 votes to put the law into immediate effect as soon as signed by the Governor."

JAPAN SEEKS CHANGE IN THE PEACE TREATY

TOKIO, Japan, June 16.—Japan has inserted an article in the Anglo-Japanese alliance pact of 1911 to remove the risk of England becoming involved in any dispute between the United States and Japan. Viscount Kato, former Japanese foreign minister, declared today that such action was necessary in urging a renewal of the treaty.

A free barbecue will be given, and the committee announces that a special "white folks" table will be provided for the invited white people.

The big feature of the day for June 19th will be a baseball game between Ballinger and Coleman. The Ballinger team recently went to Coleman and the Coleman team is coming for a return game.

The program here on the 19th will also include speech making by prominent visitors who will come quite a distance to attend the celebration.

BRITISH COLUMBIANS TO CHANGE TO "RIGHT" SIDE

VANCOUVER, B. C., June 16.

When at a date yet to be indicated by the lieutenant governor of the province, British Columbia falls into line with the rest of the American continent and changes the rule of the road from left to right, one of the largest and most intricate feats of engineering in the history of street railways operation in Canada will confront the British Columbia Electrical Railway company, costing anywhere from five hundred thousand to one million dollars. Large crews of men will have to work at least 150 days in Vancouver, probably somewhat less in Victoria where the problems are not so involved.

All cars, with the exception of interurbans, are built to conform with the "keep to the left" rule and to change the rule of the road does not simply mean turning the cars around and running them on the other track. Many replacements must be made.

All switches must be taken out and new ones installed, but perhaps the most delicate operation involved will be the rectifying of trolley wires which do not follow the natural curve, but are adjusted to swing with the car.

As the result of the change, a large influx of automobile tourists, eager to view the splendors of the Sunset province, and undeterred by fear of accident, is expected.
