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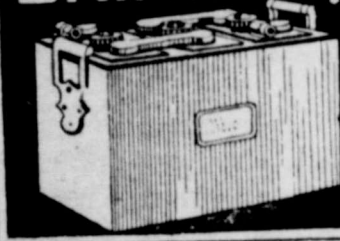

New Use for Asbestos.
A new and important use for asbestos has been found. Its wide adoption depends on the finding of new sources of the material. One of the latest suggestions, which has been carried out on an appreciable scale in the United States, is the construction and permanent casting molds for the production of the lighter kinds of metal castings. In making these molds, the ground asbestos is mixed with a suitable binder and pressed into a form or flask over a master pattern, and is then stoved slowly up to a temperature of 800 degrees F. This preliminary drying removes the bulk of the moisture, and establishes the binder. The pattern is then removed, and the form heated up again to a temperature several hundred degrees in excess of the temperature to which the form will be usually exposed. After this treatment the forms or molds are ready for use, and it is said, may be employed indefinitely; at any rate, as many as 1,700 castings have been made from one of these permanent molds.

Ten Different Winds.

When the wind is blowing at an intended velocity of 35 miles an hour the force in pounds per square foot would be 4,900. This would be known as a high wind and would travel over a distance of 3,080 feet every minute.
A perceptible wind travels one mile an hour; just perceptible, two or three miles an hour; gentle breeze, four or five miles an hour; pleasant breeze, ten to 15 miles an hour; brisk wind, 20 to 25 miles an hour; high wind, 30 to 35 miles an hour; very high wind, 40 to 45 miles an hour; storm at 50 miles an hour; a great storm, 60 to 70 miles an hour; and a hurricane attains a velocity of 80 to 100 miles an hour.

Notice is hereby given that an

election will be held on the 10th day of July 1920, at Miller School House in Common School District No. 28, of this county, as established by order of the Commissioners' Court of this County, of date the 8th day of July 1907, which is recorded in Book 4, Pages 403-404, of the minutes of said Court, (a) and as amended by order of said Court of date February 12th, 1912, which is recorded in Volume 5, Page 244 of the minutes of said Court, to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified tax paying voters of said district desire to increase special tax of 20 cents on \$100 valuation now being levied and collected in said district for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund apportioned to said district and to determine whether the Commissioners' Court of this county shall be authorized to levy, assess and

collect annually, a tax of, and at the rate of 50 cents on the \$100 valuation of taxable property in said district, for said purposes.

Ed W. Jones has been appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall, within five days after said election has been held, make due return thereof to the Commissioners' Court of this County, as required by law for holding general elections.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and County, and who are resident property taxpayers, in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election.

Each voter at said election who desires to vote for the proposition shall have written or printed on his ballot "For Increase of School Tax," and each voter desiring to vote against the proposition shall

have written or printed on his ballot "Against Increase of School Tax."

The polls at said election shall be opened at 8 o'clock a. m., and closed at 6 o'clock p. m.

County Judge of this County, by order made on the 9th day of July 1920, and this notice is given in pursuance of said order.

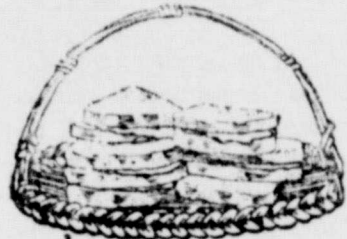

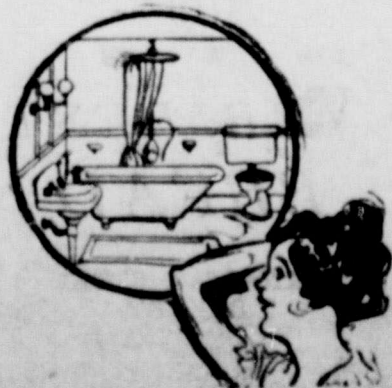

The club is composed of four young men and four young women, accompanied by and under the direction of a man and woman director. They come to Ballinger highly recommended as entertainers. Rev. Jacques had his pockets full of letters of endorsements from white people where the singers had appeared lately. They sang at the Methodist church in Temple Sunday night and were invited to return for the full rendition of their program and will sing in Houston again next week.

The entertainment is a guaranteed attraction, and Rev. Jacques says that the admission price of 25 cents for children and 50 cents for adults will be refunded to any one who is not pleased with the entertainment.
