INDIANS TESTIFY

MEXICO CITY, June 29 Several Indians were examined today as witnesses in the Jenkins case and interrogated regarding their previous testimony in the case of William O Jenkins, former American consular agent

The Indians testified that they were suspended in the air and struck and threatened with death by shooting until they agreed to testify against Jenkins, according to reports received from Puebla to El Universal, a newspaper.

Jenkins was kidnapped several months ago and held for ransom and later the charge was made against him by Mexican officials that he planned his own kidnapping and was an accomplice in his own capture.







SAN FRANCISCO, June 29. A commission to investigate industrial disputes is the basis of a Bryan plank on industrial relations. According to the plank to be submitted by Mr. Bryan, the report of the commission would not be binding upon either side, but would be a guide to public opinion which in the end would control. The plan of the plank would be to form a commission, composed of one member favoring emplyers, one favoring workers, and one impartial member. In case of disputes each side would be allowed to add one member.

Mr. Bryan said that such a plan was embodied in thirtythree peace treaties and was the cornerstone of the League of Nations.
