"Farmer-Labor" is Name Given New Organization

CHICAGO, July 15.—"Farmer-Labor" Party is the name of the new third party born of the fusion of numerous political groups here today. The new party finally agreed upon a platform and nominated candidates for the coming election.

P. P. Christensen, of Salt Lake City, is the nominee for president, and Max S. Hayes, of Cleveland, an attorney and labor leader, is the nominee for vice president on the new party ticket.

The convention adjourned when work was completed at four o'clock this morning. The strength of the new movement remains to be seen. The first test came today when a group of dissatisfied delegates, formerly allied with the committee of "forty-eight," met to consider putting out a "forty eight" ticket.

CHICAGO, July 15.—Members of the committee of forty-eight who bolted the Farmer-Labor party, today voted to stay in session until they complete the work of perfecting an organization, and

naming a ticket. No program or forecast of work has been announced. J. A. H. Hopkins, chairman of the committee, said he could not define the status of the body, but suggested that it would name or endorse a candidate for president.

MOVING OLD TROOPS FROM THE BORDER

WASHINGTON, July 15. The Fourteenth Cavalry, which has been on Mexican border duty eight years, will be relieved and sent to Fort Des Moines, Iowa, the war department announced today.

WAR GOES ON IN MEXICO

SAN ANTONIO, July 15.—Following receipt of news of hostilities across the river from Laredo, four airplanes and a machine gun company of the 37th Infantry was ordered there to re-inforce the American garrison.

SAN ANTONIO, July 15.—The Mexican garrison at Nuevo Laredo defeated a rebel attack early today, according to information reaching here, which said four hundred men in the attacking forces, under the command of Ricardo Martinez, attacked the fortress at eight o'clock this morning. The garrison was defended by 300 Obregonistas.

Germany Yields to Allied Demands With Changes

SPA, Belgium, July 15.—The Germans have agreed to the allied demands for the delivery of two million tons of coal monthly, with three new conditions added to the demands, it is announced this afternoon.

The conditions are that the German government is to have the distribution of Silesian coal or be allotted one million five hundred thousand tons monthly for Northern Germany, instead of the present allotment of one million three hundred thousand tons.

The second added condition is that a mixed commission will be sent to Essen to examine the food and housing conditions.

The third is the allies are asked by Germany to advance money or provide credit for importing additional food for the entire German population.

Foreign Minister Simmons, of the German delegation, said that he acceded to the demands of the allies to prevent the sending of an ultimatum to Germany.

TWO DRIVES NET 2000 MULE EARS

The second rabbit drive in the territory lying adjacent to and North of Ballinger was made Wednesday, and about one thousand rabbits slaughtered by the forty or fifty men and boys who took part in the fun. The first drive was made Tuesday when the crowd gathered at the Eagan place and rounded up about 1200 rabbits during the day. The drive Wednesday started at the Routh place and between 800 and 1000 rabbits were slaughtered.

The crowd taking part in the drive Wednesday were given a barbecue at the second crossing on Elm creek, and the drive extended to the L. P. Wood place East of Rannels, Wednesday afternoon.

The third drive for the territory near Ballinger was made Thursday, and a bunch of men were rounding up the rabbits. The crowd gathered at Clarence Routh's place Thursday morning.

The big drive of the season began Thursday morning at the Nelson & Nelson oil well on Mustang, where a large crowd of men met and started a campaign towards the Colorado river, with orders to halt for a picnic and barbecue dinner at the Giesecke tank. It is expected that several thousand rabbits will be killed in this drive.

Rabbit drives have also been underway on Valley creek, and in the country West of Ballinger.

WHITES AND BLACKS IN COAST COTTON FIELDS

CORPUS CHRISTI, Tex., July 15.—White persons and negroes from throughout the Southwest will be included in the cotton picking force in this section this year, reports to the Rural Landowners' Association indicate. Heretofore most of the labor brought into the district to pick cotton has been Mexican. One San Patricio county farmer recently returned from a trip on which he enlisted 200 negro pickers.

Many replies to advertisements for pickers, the association announced, were from white men who sought to come to pick cotton and then obtain a plot of ground to cultivate under rental next year.

FUTURE TRADE GRAIN RESUMED

CHICAGO, July 15.—Prices started lower than expected today for future deliveries of wheat, the first future delivery, prices quoted for nearly three years.

December delivery quotations opened at \$2.72 to \$2.75, while estimates by traders were that the future market would open with quotations about \$2.80.

Eager watching by grain traders throughout the world attended the resumption of today's pre-war methods of dealing in wheat on the Chicago board of trade. For the first time since August 25, 1917, when the government assumed control of the grain output of America, could traders buy and sell in the "pit," and business opened in the old style way.

BOLL WEEVILS INFEST OKLAHOMA COTTON

OKLAHOMA CITY, July 15.—A few boll weevils have appeared on cotton in the state and many plants are becoming infested with plant lice, according to H. H. Schultz, Federal crop reporter. Grasshoppers are invading the western counties of Oklahoma, the report says, and are becoming so thick in the western counties of Texas, Cimarron and Beaver, the condition has become serious.

Farm Agent Terry, of Concho county, was here Wednesday conferring with Farm Agent Eaton about a disease which developed among a bunch of sheep on the Edgar Jayroe place in the Crews country. Mr. Eaton called Mr. Terry over to assist him in diagnosing the case.

Mr. Jayroe lost a couple of sheep and the disease threatened to spread, and the farm agents were taking hasty steps to combat the malady. A good sheep represents several dollars and the wool growers would suffer a heavy loss should an epidemic break out in the county.

While here Mr. Terry accompanied Mr. Eaton out to the Wm. Halfmann place South of town to investigate an epidemic of sore eyes among calves on the Halfmann farm. Mr. Eaton had been applying remedies to the calf disease, and it is believed that there will be no further spread.

GALVESTON CITY OFFICIALS OUSTED

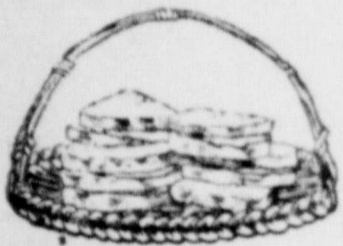

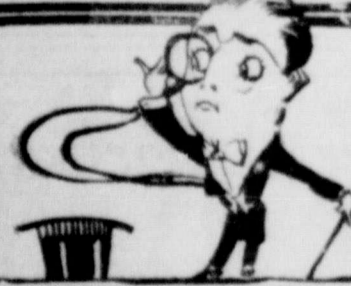

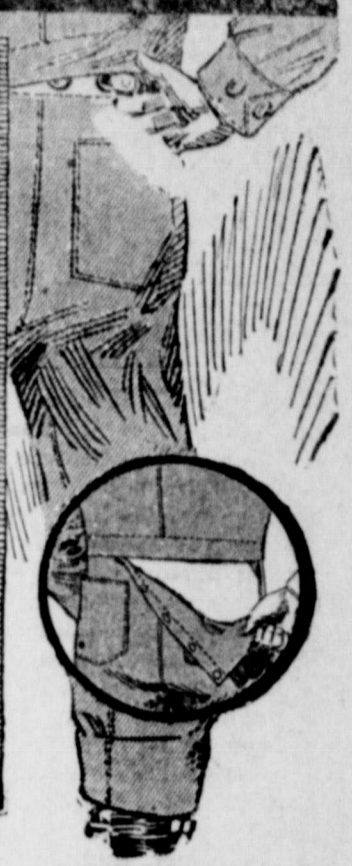
