STRIKE MAY FOLLOW PAY AWARD

CHICAGO, July 19.-If reports reaching the railroad brotherhood leaders regarding the wage award which is to be announced tomorrow by the labor board is correct, the decision will be unacceptable and rejected, union leaders declared today.

While none of the brotherhood leaders predict publicly that a general strike is possible, if the award is unsatisfactory, they assert privately on trustworthy information reaching the Associated Press that the award is so low that it will not be accepted.

Some leaders say that the temper of the men is such that they doubt that an immediate walk-out, whether authorized or unauthorized, can be averted, if the men are not satisfied with the award, and it is believed that the award will be lower than the men expect and so low that they will not accept it.


