The conference has four courses of action under consideration. They can accept the labor board's wage increase of about twentyone percent under protest, or accept it with a proviso for the preparation of a new wage demand to start immediately. They can decide on a tentative rejection of the award and submit the question of a strike to a referendum, or they can decide on a flat rejection and exercise the plenary powers of the grand council of the brotherhoods toward an immediat strike.

All reports from the conference of the railroad unions officials today indicate that the conservatives who are disposed to accept the wage board's decision in the wage increase, will prevail. 




