COX IN ACCEPTANCE SPEECH GIVES VIEWS ON PARTY CAMPAIGN ISSUES

DAYTON, Aug. 7.—Governor James M. Cox, in a speech accepting the Democratic nomination, outlined the important issues upon which the democratic party will go to the people and ask that the constructive work of the party be carried on by the election of Mr. Cox in the November election.

Notwithstanding that the weather interfered somewhat with the occasion, the notification program was carried out, and the democratic candidate's message sent to the people, after he was officially notified.

DAYTON, Aug. 7.—An early promise of fair weather for the notification exercises of Gov. Cox was broken by gathering clouds, and by ten o'clock a light rain arrived, with local thunder showers predicted for the day and tomorrow. The rain this morning, however, was not sufficient to drive the crowds to cover.

Gov. Cox began at once the discussion of the League of Nations. He said that Senator Harding had made a new pledge of policy in behalf of his party, and quoted Mr. Harding as saying:

"I promise you formal and effective peace so quickly as a Republican congress can pass its declaration for a Republican executive to sign."

This means but one thing—a separate peace with Germany.

"This would be the most disheartening event in civilization since the Russians made their separate peace with Germany, and infinitely more unworthy on our part than it was on that of the Russians. They were threatened with starvation and revolution had swept their country. Our soldiers fought side by side with the allies. So complete was the coalition of strength and purpose that General Foch was given supreme command, and every soldier in the allied cause, no matter what flag he followed, recognized him as his chief. We fought the war together, and now before the thing is through it is proposed to enter into a separate peace with Germany. In good faith we pledged our strength with our associates for the enforcement of terms upon offending powers, and now it is suggested that this be withdrawn. Suppose Germany, recognizing the first break in the Allies, proposes something we can not accept. Does Senator Harding intend to send an army to Germany to press her to our terms? Certainly the allied army could not be expected to render aid. If, on the other hand, Germany

should accept the chance we offered of breaking the bond it would be for the express purpose of insuring a German-American alliance, recognizing that the Allies—in fact, no nation in good standing—would have anything to do with either of us.

"This plan would not only be a piece of bungling diplomacy, but plain, unadulterated dishonesty, as well."

"No less an authority than Senator Lodge said, before the heat of recent controversy, that to make peace expect in company with the Allies would 'brand us everlastingly with dishonor and bring ruin to us.'"

"And then after peace is made with Germany, Senator Harding would, he says, 'hopefully approach the nations of Europe and of the earth, proposing that understanding which makes us a willing participant in the concentration of nations to a new relationship.'"

In short America, refusing to enter the League of Nations (now already established by twenty-nine nations) and bearing and deserving the contempt of the world would submit an entirely new project. This act would either be regarded as arrant madness or attempted international bossism.

"The plain truth is, that the Republican leaders, obsessed with a determination to win the presidential election, have attempted to satisfy too many divergent views. Inconsistencies, inevitable under the circumstances, rise to haunt them on every hand, and they find themselves arrayed in public thought at least, against a great principle. More than that their conduct is opposed to the idealism upon which their party prospered in other days."

"We advocate immediate ratification of the Treaty without reservations, which would impair its essential integrity, but do not oppose the acceptance of any reservation making clearer or more specific the obligations of the United States to the League associates," said Mr. Cox.

Mr. Cox criticized the Republican congress for laboring for two years without taking any steps to reduce or repeal the war taxes levied on the American people during the war. "Federal taxation must be heavily reduced," said Mr. Cox, "and it will be done at once, if a Democratic administration is chosen in November."

Discussing the labor question Mr. Cox said:

"Capital develops into large units without violence to public sentiment or injury to public interest—the same principle should not be denied to labor. Collective bargaining through the means of representatives selected by the employer and employee respectively, will be helpful, rather than harmful to the general interest. Besides, there is no ethical objection that can be raised to it. We

COX NAMED FOR GOOD OF PARTY

DAYTON, Aug. 7.—Hailed as a candidate in whose selection "neither midnight cabals nor plutocratic cabals were instrumental," Governor James M. Cox was formally notified today by Senator Robinson of Arkansas, chairman of the notification committee, that he had been chosen by the Democratic National Convention as the party's presidential nominee.

"The convention reached its decision through the exercise of untrammeled judgment by the delegates without inducement of coercion from political masses," the senator said. "The honor and responsibility that go with this nomination came to you because your position respecting campaign issues is known to be in harmony with the platform of the party and because the majority of your public service demonstrates rare leadership."

Senator Robinson referred to the nominee's exceptional executive ability, his remarkable record as governor of Ohio, pointing out the splendid progressive and constructive measures enacted under his administration, especially mentioning the workman's compensation law, the budget system, rural schools, prison reforms and pointing to how Mr. Cox had successfully handled industrial disturbances and emphasized the great fact that the candidate was in perfect accord with the platform constructed by the progressive democrats at the San Francisco convention.

"The custom of giving formal notice of their selection to party nominees originated when methods of transmitting intelligence were slow and unreliable," said Senator Robinson. "Means of communication now available render notification ceremonies, in a sense superfluous. The practice continues chiefly because it affords an opportune occasion for the candidate to express his interpretation of platform declarations under conditions which give to his views great publicity."

"The circumstances attending your nomination should be highly gratifying to you. The San Francisco convention considered the qualifications of a number of able and loyal Democrats, including leaders of mature experience and nation-wide renown. From the time the delegates first assembled you were a favorite. Throughout the proceedings laudable rivalry and good will prevailed. When on the 44th ballot you were nominated, the action of the Convention was practically unanimous. Seldom a contest so impetuous has terminated so harmoniously. You are not only the choice of the convention but the choice is almost universally approved by Democrats and meets with the favor of many independent voters."

POLAND MAKES KNOWN TERMS ON WHICH SHE COULD AGREE TO PEACE

RIOTING IN ILLINOIS RESUMED

WEST FRANKFORT, Aug. 7.—Esporadic rioting in the Illinois city again today, and one is dead is reported.

Louis Carrari, aged forty, was shot and beaten to death by the mob. This is the first known death since Sunday night.

YAQUI INDIANS TO LOWER CALIF.

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 7.—The first three thousand troops, sent to Lower California to quell the Cantu insurrection, is made up mostly of Yaqui Indians, according to the Excelsior, which was quoting a war department official.

Various ships have been chartered to transport the troops, and some vessels will be armed with cannons for the protection of the men when they disembark on the western side of the Gulf of California. Puerto Isabel, in the state of Sonora, is to be a concentration point.

COAL MINERS TO RETURN TO WORK

PITTSBURG, Aug. 7.—The first definite break-away from the power of Alexander Howat by the Kansas coal miners came today with the return to work of the men at the mine at Frontenac. The loading of coal will be resumed there today.

GEORGETOWN FARMER SHOOT AT AIRPLANE

Temple, Tex., Aug. 7.—Air Pilot E. A. Locking, in charge of a commercial airplane, narrowly escaped death Thursday afternoon near Georgetown, where he was attacked by a farmer with a high powered rifle and his plane riddled with bullets.

WARSAW, Aug. 7.—The essentials of the terms of peace Poland would be willing to accept are detailed in a note sent to Moscow in acceptance of the Soviet proposal to send delegates to Minsk for the purpose of negotiating an armistice, and take steps leading to peace.

Poland says that she is compelled to demand formal guarantees that the Polish delegates will be permitted free and direct communication with home, before the delegates will be sent to the conference.

It is stated by Poland that she is ready to conclude peace on the principle of national rights, and to try to reach a solution of all questions with regard to the guarantee of future peace and friendly relations between Russia and her neighbors.

DENVER UNDER MILITARY RULE

DENVER, Aug. 7.—Striking tramway trainmen voted today to end the strike and return to work if the company would permit them to return in a body and send the strikebreakers out of town.

The strikers instructed their counsel to confer with the company officials this afternoon.

General Manager Hinds of the tramway company, said that the company was determined to work whom it pleased and would retain the men imported to break the strike.

DENVER, Aug. 7.—Denver is under military rule following two days of violence as a result of the street car strike at this place. The control of the city was turned over to the military authorities early today. General Ballou and 250 soldiers, from Fort Logan are in charge and 500 additional troops are enroute to reinforce the soldiers in charge.

Three men were killed in last night's rioting.

DENVER, Aug. 7.—Mayor Bailey this afternoon issued a proclamation ordering all theatres to close at 7 o'clock tonight.

The police department has requested citizens to remain in tonight in the hope of preventing recurrence of rioting.

DENVER, Aug. 7.—Fear that rioting by street car strikers their sympathizers and strikebreakers will be resumed, was expressed in official circles today. No attempt had been made up to 10 o'clock this morning to operate cars.

H. H. Tammen, one of the owners of the Denver Post, said today he could not estimate damage done by the mob to the Post plant. The Post was issued as usual from its own plant today.

Strikebreakers at the South Denver car barns today were patrolling the yard in front of the barns with rifles on their shoulders.

In preparation for possible resumption of hostilities tonight, the police today prepared to mount two machine guns. Hundreds of sawed off shotguns and army rifles were being assembled at police headquarters. Up to 11 a. m., more than 600 citizens had answered Mayor Bailey's call for volunteers.

MANNIX TO BE RECEIVED CORDIALLY AT LIVERPOOL
LIVERPOOL, Aug. 7.—Councillor Kelly, president of the Irish Self-determination League and an ardent Sinn Feiner, declared that if Archbishop Mannix lands in Liverpool, he will be given such a reception as was never accorded an Irishman in Liverpool.

WARSAW, Aug. 7.—The Polish Foreign office has sent a note to the Allies, and a special note to the United States explaining the actual political situation in Poland, it has been learned.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—The special not on the political situation in Poland, which has been telegraphed from Warsaw to the United States has not been received, the state department announced today.

LONDON, Aug. 7.—The Russian bolshevik armies are hammering at the Polish lines northeast and east of Warsaw. The enemy seems to have encountered stern resistance and the Poles are making a strong stand, with the exception of the area around Brestlitovsk, east of Warsaw. No new advances have the Russians been able to make elsewhere and where the Russians have attacked the Poles are holding them back by desperate fighting.

PAPER SUITS ARE LATEST BLOW AT OLD H. C. L.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—Paper suits, which have attained quite a vogue in Germany and Austria, will soon make their appearance in the United States, and if the inquiries of the department of commerce may be taken as an indication of the probable demand, they may become more popular in lowering the cost of living than was the overall movement.

Cable orders for samples of the suits have been dispatched by the department of commerce, it has been announced, and when they arrive, they will be displayed in the departments of the district and co-operative offices in the various important cities of the United States.

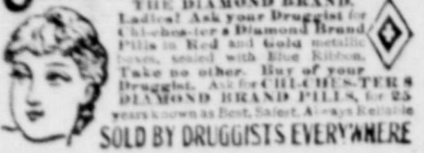

TALPA CITIZEN KILLED IN N. M.

Roy Clayton was here from Talpa Saturday and reported the killing of Tom Hinnard, a former Talpa man, and a good friend of the Clayton's and a son-in-law of W. A. Summers, of the Talpa country. Mr. Hinnard was killed in New Mexico by two men by the name of Starkey. One of the Starkey brothers was also killed in the gun fight and the other wounded. Hinnard is survived by a wife and several children, and his family was with him in New Mexico. Mrs. Hinnard's father, Mr. Summers, went to New Mexico on receipt of a message of his son-in-law's death and the remains of Hinnard were buried at White Oak, New Mexico.

NORTON COUNTRY COMING WITH CROP

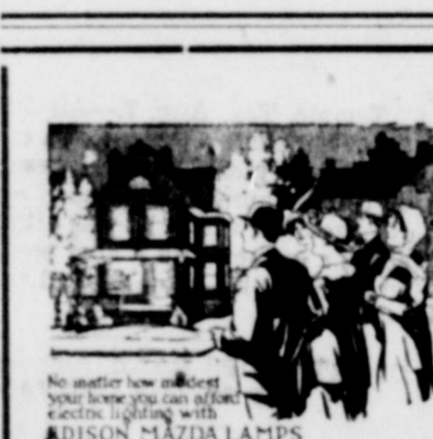

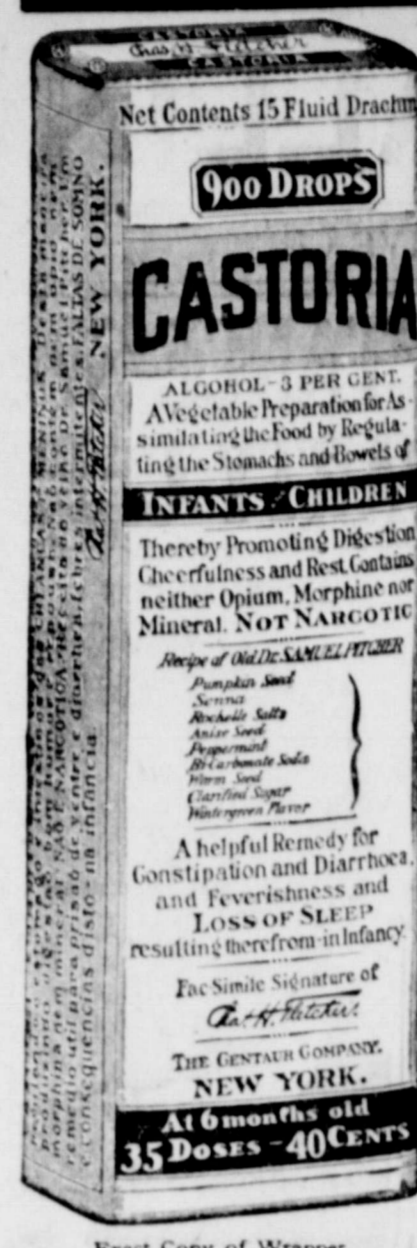

Cox In Acceptance Speech Gives Views on Issues In Party Campaign

 should not, by law, abridge a man's right either to labor or to quit his employment. However, neither labor nor capital should at any time or in any circumstances, take action that would put in jeopardy the public welfare.

"There is another reason for the fabulous contributions to the present Republican campaign fund. Much money, of course, has been subscribed in proper partisan zeal, but the great bulk has been given with the definite idea of gaining service in return. Many captains of industry, guided by a most dangerous industrial philosophy, believe that in controversy between employer and employee their will should be enforced, even at the point of the bayonet. I speak knowingly. I have passed through many serious industrial troubles. I know something of their psychology, the stages through which they pass, and the dangerous attempts that are sometimes made to end them. Disputes between labor and capital are inevitable. The disposition to gain the best bargain possible characterizes the whole field of exchange, whether it be product for product, or labor for money. If strikes are prolonged public opinion always settles them. Public opinion should determine results in America. Public opinion is the most interesting characteristic of a democracy, and it is the real safety valve to the institutions of a free government. It may at times, be necessary for government to inquire into the facts of a tie-up, but facts and not conclusions should be submitted. The determining form of unprejudiced thought will do the rest.

Gov. Cox unreservedly in favor of woman suffrage and discussed that question at length, reviewing the constructive service of the women during and since the war. He declared that the women helped to win the war and that there are now entitled to a voice in the readjustment now at hand.

"Their intuition, their sense of the humanitarian in government, their unquestioned progressive spirit will be helpful in problems that require public judgment. Therefore they are entitled to the privilege of voting as a matter of right and because they will be helpful in maintaining wholesome and patriot policy. It requires but one more state to ratify the national amendment and thus bring a long-delayed justice. I have the same earnest hope as one platform expresses, that some one of the remaining states will promptly take favorable action."

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—The Marshall and East Texas Railway has applied to the Interstate Commerce Commission for permission to abandon the operation of its line in Upshur and Harrison counties in this state. They have asked to be allowed to remove their tracks and sell their property in these counties.

In cleaning mirrors and pictures great care must be taken that no water seep under the glass. Water will ruin the back of a mirror and blister the picture.

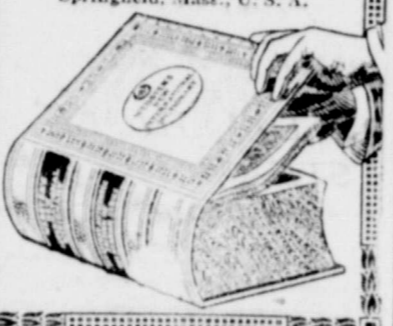
Perhaps the safest way to polish and clean these glasses is to use a damp chamoliskin. Wring the chamoliskin as dry as possible out of warm water, rub the glass until perfectly clean and dip the chamoliskin into clean water and again wring dry. Rub the glass the second time and polish with paper if necessary, but it won't be. This way of cleaning mirrors and pictures does not endanger the frame in any way and is very satisfactory.

USE FRUIT TO MAKE JARS

Common Household Utensils Constructed of Peculiar Ware in Central Province of India.

There is a peculiar ware that is made by the Banjars in the central provinces of India from the fruit of the aoula. The fruit is collected and dried. It is then boiled in water until quite soft and pounded, the stones removed and the pulp beaten up and worked with the hands into a thick, brown, sticky mass. When this is quite ready the manufacturer takes an earthen vessel—any shape that pleases him—and covers it all over with a thick layer or coat of the pulp. This is then put aside to set a bit, and when hard rude devices are stamped round the neck and shoulders of the article, which is then set aside to dry. When entirely hard, the glazura inside is broken and the pieces removed. These vegetable pots are sold according to size from four to eight annas each.

The aoula tree is abundant throughout the forests of tropical India and Burma, and the fruits are frequently employed in medicine and for tanning. Another material used for making jars is the root of the great asphodel. The fleshy root of this plant, by drying in a sand oven and grinding, is prepared into a flour, which, when mixed with hot water, yields a most tenacious vegetable glue with which the Persians make great vessels for holding oil and clarifying butter. The native cobblers employ it in preference to animal glue in their work.

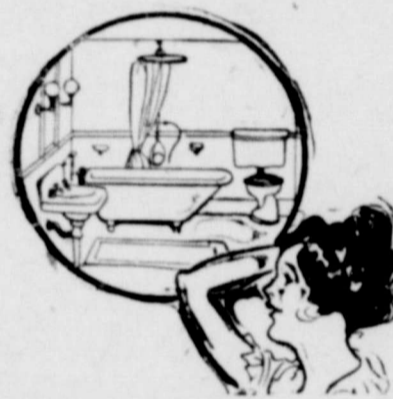
