

COMPANY'S MUST PAY

QUARTERLY TAX AUSTIN, Aug. 9 .- It is announce ed by the comptroller's department that all electric light, water works and interurban railway companies, not municipally owned and situated in cities which have attained a population of 10,000 as disclosed by the 1920 census, are required to pay a quarterly gross receipts iax to the comptroller's department. There are said to be several such companies in the state which, under the 1910 census did not have to pay the tax be cause the cities in which they are situated did not have a population of 10,000, but many of these places have now the required pop ulation and such companies are subject to the tax]. The tax is 1-4 per cent of the gross receipts and in cities of 20,000 population or more the tax is 1-2 per cent.


