At midnight the Texas Election Bureau announced that Hon. Pat M. Neff had swept the state in the run-off race for governor, and forecasted that the final majority over Joseph W. Bailey would be about 100,000.

At this hour the election bureau had compiled returns from 176 counties, some of which were complete, and many almost complete. Out of this number Neff received 194,129 and Bailey 129,-606, giving Neff a lead of 64,523.

Mr. Neff had carried practically every county heard from, and his majority increased with each report. Comal and Bexas counties were the only counties giving barrey a majority as shown by
