



"The church cannot be hesitant here. When, as may often happen, the inclusiveness of its fel lowship precludes a cooperation judgment on the part of the whole church, the pulpit must nevertheless be true to its prophetic office. The case is hopeless if employers will not allow collective action by their workers. The church must stand for the right of organization and collective action, under proper ethical restraints and safeguards for public welfare.

"The church cannot allow itself to be estopped from this course either by pressure from reactionary employees on the one hand or by manifest evils in the labor movement on the other. It must be strong enough to attack these evils and to resist the pressure. It must urge employers, especial ly Christian employers, to work out democratic principles in their establishments with due time for investigation and experiment. The important matter is not just what plan is followed, but that the start is made, and that everything that is done be on the road to a definite goal-the development of democratic factory organization in which all truly cooperaand which is for the benefit of each and all."


