Wholesale Prices Show Decline During August

(Associated Press Dispatch) WASHINGTON, Sept. 18. -A pronounced drop in the general level of wholesale prices of food and clothing during the month of August, is reported by the department of labor statistics.

The decline on food and clothing measured a four and one-half per cent decrease

Food stuffs showed the greatest price concessions, the decline on food stuffs averaging more than twelve per cent. Clothing declined five and three-quarters per cent.

While food and clothing show a decline, farm products came down, the average figuring nearly six per cent. Fuel and lighting materials continued an upward trend during August, increasing more than six and one quarter per cent. Metals and house furnishing goods also show an increase over July.

Sharp declines in food and clothing during the present month will be revealed in the September report, and it is expected that the general average will be greater than the drop in August. Wholesalers in many lines have made reductions, and advanced offerings show a decline in clothing and foodstuffs.




