# **ACCEPTANCES** URGED TO AID COTTON LOANS

Would Make Country's Credit Resources Available to Growers and Lighten Burden on Southern Banks.

UNIFORM WAREHOUSING

Natitonal Bank of Commerce in New York Says Discount Market Requires Standard Receipt Which Will Protect Loans.

financing cotton growers is advocated by the National Bank of Commerce in New York as a remedy for the handto-mouth crop-lien system now in general use. In its magazine, Commerce Monthly, the bank points out that cotfore have not shared in the country's credit resources because the obligations of the generality of borrowers in this field have not been suitable for negotiation in the open market. The burden of financing has been concentrated on a limited number of South ern banks. Such a system has been responsible in a large degree for compelling the dumping of cotton on the market almost as rapidly as it could

be picked and ginned. The bank points out that a means of securing a broader distribution of the burden has been provided by the Federal reserve system, which enables member banks both to rediscount loans and to execute acceptances. which are particularly suitable for general negotiation. "A reasonable method of improving application of fairly uniform laws conearning rotton warehousing wherever stron is stored. Two laws base all ready been formulated which, were their provisions uniformly and jointly applicable to cotton warehouses would go far loward establishing warehouse receipts on the high level of the bill of lading. These are the Uniform Warehouse Receipts Law and the Federal Warehouse Act adopted in 1916. The latter provides for Fest eral supervision and examination of licensed warehouses which take advantage of its provisions. The Uniform Warehouse Receipts Act, on the other hand, is concerned with putting the receipt itself into proper form making standard the terms which it is crowned by the areabishop of York. incorporates and the obligations assumed by the warehouseman, and making standard also the conditions attending its transfer or negotiation. "As regards the Uniform Ware house Receipts Act, there would seem to be no valid reason why its provisions should not be incorporated in their entirety in the statutes of every state. The Federal Warehouse Act is pot compulsory, and warehouses have been, and probably will continue to be, slow to avail themselves of its provisions because of the public supervision for which it provides. A remedy might be found either in the estab hishment of a similar system of public supervision by the respective states. or in a provision in state laws that all public warehouses be required to obtain federal licenses, the latter nethod being decidedly preferable becuse of the greater uniformity it

The juristion of the latter extends over the province or county of York, which includes ten discesses in that part of England from the Humber to the Dee and embraces the Isle of Man as well The rest of England is under the jurisdiction of the archbishop of Canserbury. That dignitary, however, as primate of all England, is supposed to possess a certain authority over the church in the whole country. He takes precedence on all public occasions, not only of the archbishop of York, but of all the nobility save the pediate members of the royal fam-By. He crowns the king, but the queen

Probably the most extraordinary checker board in the world was con (O.) Disput h. It was made of solid blocks of concrete three feet thick and its surface covered an area 25 feet square. The pieces were moved by hooked iron rods, making the game of value as physical as well as a mer tal exercise.

A checker board which was presented to Bismarck at the height of his fame is said to have been the most costly thing of its kind ever made. The squares were made of gold and silver inlaid upon an ebony base. There were 24 "men," 12 of gold and 12 of silver. 





#### HAVE MUCH ECONOMIC VALUE

Official of Museum of Natural History Tells of Importance of Bats in Jamaica.

Returning recently from the island alca, in the West Indies, where spent four months on a scientific expedition, H. E. Anthony, associate of Natural History, brought back with him many fine specimens of bats which are numerous on that and other lands in the West Indies, says the w York Times.

The only mammals native to the nd today," Mr. Anthony said, "are 20 species of bats and one species of ent. These different bats range in from small bats, with a wing spread of six inches, up to very large nts, with a wing spread of from 28 to 30 inches."

People in the United States, where bats are comparatively rare animals, have no idea of the variety and abundance of them in such a place as Jamaica, or of the important economic value of the bat. They are either in sect eating or feed on fruits. The insect-eating variety are small or the most part, and have considerable value as insect destroyers. They feed on mosquitoes and on a great variety of winged insect life, many of which are obnoxious to man or injurious to
