MEXICO CITY, Sept. 25 .- The leaders of the "Communist Federation Mexican Proletariat" voted to call a general strike on October first, unless the dispute settled before September 30th.

It was stated that such action was taken in conjunction with similar organizations of the United States and Canada, and that the movement was being fostered by the Industrial Workers of the World with the intention of making it effective in three countries.




