

HOGS SURE ENEMY TO COTTON PESTS

When his attention was called to & report that a farmer in Brown county, near Blanket, had solved the boll weevil problem by running hogs in his cotton patch, C. C. French, Industrial Agent for the Fort Worth Stock Yards, Signature of went to Blanket and made a personal Ainvestigation, and after making a thorough investigation on September 27th, he reports the conditions he found somewhat as

follows: In an adjoining field consisting of twelve acres from 85 per cent to 90 per cent of the bolls were two bales of cotton. On the experimental plot of twenty three acres where the hogs were allowed to range, the cotton will make he is to occupy. a half bale to the acre and probably more. Mr. French states the county clerk's office, and is that he took up one stalk of cotton with fifty two bolls, none of run of things in order to be prewhich were punctured. They have been run-ning in the patch ever since the gave Mr. Forgey this privilege. first punctured forms have fallen.

As a further evidence of the value of the pigs running in the cotton field, Mr. French found that where the pigs slept at night near the barn and their watering place, there were practically no punetured bolls; out in remote parts of the field where the pigs ranged less frequently, the punctures were more numerous. The cotton was in no way damaged by the hogs. Mr. Starling, the owner of the farm, has been conducting this experiment for the past six years, and has found that it has given him uniform results every year.






