Citizens to Keep County

A number of farmers met in the office of the Young Men's Business League Thursday afternoon and took steps to raise the \$1,000 to pay the county's part of the expense of continuing the Farm Agent's work in this county.

It was announced that the work would continue with only slight interruption by the action of the Commissioners' Court in recently voting to discontinue the work.

An expense, which if paid by the county, would amount to about one-half a cent per capita will be shouldered by private citizens, who will subscribe to a fund being raised to carry on the

While the county's part of the expense is being paid by private subscriptions, the State and National agricultural departments, which together are paying more than one-half of the salary of the Farm Agent, want it thoroughly understood that the local Farm Agent will serve everyone who needs his services. It is a county-wide proposition, and the work will be carried on as here-tofore. Every farmer is welcome to call on the agent, and is invited to co-operate with him in his work. So far as is known no change will be made and Mr. Eaton will remain on the job.


