## **HOBBY GRANTS** 2000 PARDONS

AUSTIN, Jan. 17.—During his dministration Governor Hobby granted approximately 2,000 par dons and placed 200 convicts on parole, the State executive advised the 37th Legislature today in a message dealing specially with this phase of his administra-

"I have doubtless made mistakes in the exercise of this power," said the governor, "but when the people conferred this power upon the governor they knew that some mistakes would be made, because no human could unerringly exercise it.

In another message today Gov. Hobby deals with the penitentiary system. It was shown by his message that the prison system had been operated at a profit and was now on a cash basis, while \$2,164,337 had been paid out in permanent improvements. The governor recommended the enactment of a law prohibiting the leasing of State lands for cultivation after the termination of the leases now in operation.


