

Oldest Example of Tapestry.

The opening of a reliquaire in the ancient church in Saint-Josse-sur-Mer. department of Pas de Calais, France, revealed an elaborate tapestry which is more than 1,000 years old and which Eustache III of Boulogne brought back with him from a crusade to the Holy Land. The value of the tapestry is estimated at more than \$500,000, as it is in perfect condition.

The tapestry has been presented to the French Academy of Inscriptions by the Trocadero museum, which traced its origin. According to experts, it bears the name of Wegtekin Cadl, who was put to death by his master in Khorassan in the year A. D. 961. Therefore, the tapestry is older than that found in the tomb of Charlemagne, which is now carefully preserved in Afx-la-Chapelle,
