Mr. Flynt followed the man into the house, and was scuffling with him over the gun, when Mrs. Davis got another gun-a pistol, and it is alleged was in the act of shooting the officer when he shot her, the bullet from the sheriff's gun striking her in one of the lower limbs.

In turning the man over to a deputy, according to a phone message to The Ledger from Ed Eason at Winters, Mr. Flynt stated that he did not shoot the woman to kill her, and aimed his gun in such a way as not to strike vital parts of the body. He stated that for some time he shielded himself from the woman by keeping her husband between himself and the muzzle of her gun, which she was aiming towards him in orders from her husband to "shoot him.

After Sheriff Flynt fired one shot both Davis and his wife gave up, and the officer took possession of their guns. It was reported that the woman was being rushed to the sanitarium at Winters, while Davis was be ing-brought to Ballinger.


