Satisfactory telephone communication depends to a considerable extent upon the proper functioning of a number of "cords" in the transmission line between the two telephones.

There are, for instance, the "transmitter cords" and "receiver cord" on the telephones themselves; the long cord on the desk telephone; the "switchboard cords" in the central exchange-

These "cords" are composed of many tiny wires bound together and wrapped with silk, cotton or other protective material. "Kinks" or rough handling will break the little wires; dampness will penetrate the covering and destroy the insulation—then the cord is

Switchboard cords are constantly inspected. Cords on telephones are less accessible to the repairman; for "the good of the service" they should be protected against liquids, kinks, sudden jerks or other damage that will impair their usefulness.


