



The death and resurrection of Christ occurred at about the time of the Passover, which Jesus and his disciples had gone to Jerusalem to observe. The only allusion in the New Testa ment that would indicate a very early observance of Easter, as a feast cele brating the Resurrection, is in the first collection of the letters of St. Paul to the Christians of the church in Corinth; fifth chapter and seventh and eighth verses: "Purge out the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, even as ye are unleavened For our passover also has been sacrificed, even Christ: wherefore let us keep the feast, not with the old leaven, neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and

In the subsequent records the first allusion to Easter is in connection with a dispute between two group of Christians as to the date of the observance when, in the last decade of the second century of the Christian era. Polycrates bishop of Ephesus and Irenaeus, bishop of Lyons, wrote letters to Victor of Rome, differing with him on the subject of the proper date for the feast.

The crucifixion occurred on the sixth day of the week, or Friday.
