VAN PELT-PYBURN

5 NEGROES GET 11 YEARS IN 1 HOUR 15 MIN.

District court made record time here Wednesday afternoon when five negroes were tried, given a total of eleven years in the state penitentiary and sentenced to the prison within one hour and fifteen minutes.

After a day and half's drag in the Alexander-Roberts-Hughes arson case, the court speeded up and for at least one hour and a half the wheels of justice turned in a hurry.

The cases were all new on the docket, and the ink did not hardly get dry before the defendants were arraigned for trial, all signified that they wanted to plead guilty.

A jury was drawn and the case of Charley King, charged with forgery, was the first called. The indictment was read to the jury, statements of witnesses introduced, and the defendant made a few remarks in his own behalf, and the jury retired to the jury room. All five of the negroes were in court without counsel, and waived all rights of defense.

While jury No. 1 was deliberating a second jury was drawn, and Henry Anderson, charged with burglary, heard the indictment against him read, and after hearing the state introduce statements of witnesses, the negro made a few remarks and the jury went out to vote its verdict.

Simultaneous with the retirement of jury No. 2, jury No. 1 came in with a verdict assessing punishment for King at two years in the pen.

Jury No. 1 went in the box and after the formality of hearing an indictment read charging Jim Johnson with forgery, and the introduction of statements of witnesses in the case, retired to the jury room to find a verdict, and jury No. 2 came in with a verdict against Anderson, fixing his punishment at three years in the pen.

Jury No. 2 was given the case of Willis Thompson, charged with receiving stolen goods, and after the formal reading of the indictment and statements of witnesses, retired, and jury No. 1 came in with a two year sentence for Jim Johnson.

Jury No. 1 went to the box and heard the indictment read against Adam Wilson, charging forgery, and retired to deliberate, making room for jury No. 2, which came in with a sentence of two years for Willis Thompson.

Within a few minutes jury No. 1 came in with the fifth verdict, and assessed punishment for Wilson at two years in the pen.

The court excused the jury for the term, and asked the negroes to stand and be sentenced, if they wished to waive the two days and have their sentences begun at once. Sentence was passed.

The docket was closed for the week, and the court announced a recess until Monday afternoon at one-thirty, when the Boland murder case will be called.

In less than thirty minutes after he had been sentenced to two years in the pen, a petition had been drawn and signed by the district judge and all members of the jury who convicted him, and a number of other citizens, asking Gov. Neff to pardon Willis Thompson.

It developed in the trial of the case against Thompson that he had been a good negro all his life, had a large family and was made a "tool" of a white man in disposing of stolen property. The Wharton county sheriff, who happened to be here after another negro, testified that he had known Thompson all his life, and never knew him to be in any trouble and that he had the reputation of being a good negro. Wharton county friends will attempt to get a pardon for him.

MANY DEAD IN GERMAN RIOTS

HAMBURG, Germany, March 24.—Fifteen civilians and one police officer were killed and six persons wounded in riots here late Wednesday. The deaths resulted from an attack made on the mob by officers, after the mob refused to disperse when ordered to do so.

The mob attempted to break the police cordon about the Vulcan ship yards and made an attempt to disarm the police. The police ordered the crowd to disperse and the order was ignored. The officers then opened fire on the mob, throwing hand grenades into the mob.

The Blohm and Voss ship yards where there was considerable fighting Wednesday have been closed.

Communist leaders tried to hold a mass demonstration at Heiligengeist Field in the Altona section of the city, but were unable to obtain possession of the field as the police erected a barbed wire entanglement around the field and stationed armored cars at strategic points.

Being foiled in their attempt to hold a meeting the crowd stoned the cars and street car service was suspended during the day, and some streets have been barred off and no travel allowed on them.

The Communist "Volks Zeitung" here has asked the workers to arm themselves. Reports of serious rioting in Eisleben, in Prussian Saxony, have been received here. The police were attacked by mobs and the mobs looted shops in the above place, it is reported.

BERGDOLL CASE UNDER REVIEW

WASHINGTON, March 24.—The papers from the war department relating to the case of Grover Cleveland Bergdoll, escaped American draft evader and who is now in Germany, were transmitted to the state department today under the direction of Secretary Weeks, with the request that the case be considered from an international viewpoint.

GALVESTON, March 24.—S. C. Toibert, secretary and treasurer of the Gulf, Colorado & Santa Fe Railway, was found dead in his berth on a Santa Fe train this morning. Mr. Toibert had been to Fort Worth on business and left that city for his home here last night. Before retiring to his berth he asked the porter to awaken him before reaching Houston this morning, and he was found dead when the porter went to his berth to arouse him.

Deceased had been with the Santa Fe for more than thirty years.

BISHOP GIBBONS PASSES AWAY

BALTIMORE, Md., March 24.—James Cardinal Gibbons, archbishop of Baltimore, and private American of the Catholic church, died at the Arch Episcopal residence here today after a prolonged illness in which the trouble mainly affected his heart. Gibbons was eighty-seven years old. His end came peacefully at 11:33 o'clock this morning.

BALTIMORE, Md., March 24.—Cardinal Gibbons is much weaker today, according to announcement of his physicians this morning. The medical attendants announced that all hope for the cardinal's recovery was abandoned last night.

INCOME TAXES SWELL DEPOSITS

WASHINGTON, March 24.—Income profits tax collections for March 15th installment were estimated today to be \$675,000,000. Secretary Mellon said Mr. Mellon said that \$650,000,000 had actually been deposited from collections to the close of business on March 22nd. He estimated that on this basis the total revenue from income taxes for the fiscal year ending June 30th, would be \$3,050,000,000.00.

H. B. TERRELL DEAD AT SAN ANTONIO

SAN ANTONIO, March 24.—Henry B. Terrell, former comptroller of Texas, and for a number of years prominent in state politics, died here today after a prolonged illness.

Deceased served several years as a member of the Texas legislature and two terms as a member of the state senate, and was prominently mentioned as a gubernatorial candidate in the last campaign, but failing health prohibited him from entering the race.

The body will be sent to Austin and funeral will take place in the capital later in the week.

GERMANY GIVEN ANOTHER NOTICE

PARIS, March 24.—The allied reparations commission today notified the German government that a total of twenty billion gold marks which are due the allies under the terms of Article 235 of the peace treaty, must be paid by May first, or the allies will inflict additional penalties on Germany.

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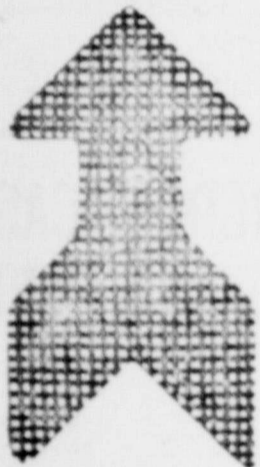

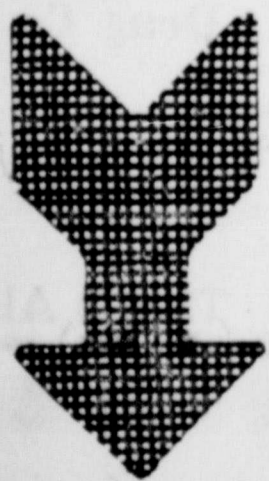

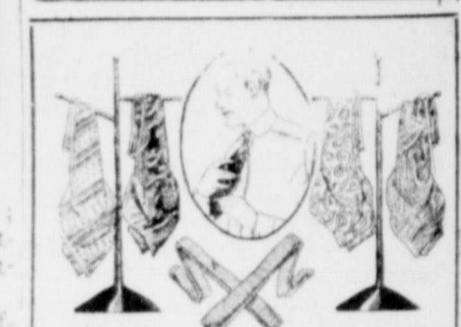
