EAST BLIGHTED FOR EASTER

Tonight local showers; Sunday partly cloudy and colder.

WASHINGTON, March 26.—The Weather Bureau today forecast anything but favorable weather for the annual Easter parade. Unexpected storm weather marked the intensity of the blight for Easter Sunday, with the tail of the storm swinging low over the South and Eastern Colorado. This caused a revision of the preliminary forecasts of fair weather tomorrow.

The storm is sweeping East and Northeastward and the pressure is high today off the Atlantic coast, with high winds rising rapidly Northwest. The weather is also acting badly elsewhere East of the Mississippi. Showers and thunder storms prevail over New York and the Great Lakes and the lower Mississippi valley. Everwhere East of the Mississippi river unsettled weather is promised.

NEW ORLEANS, March 26.—Southeast storm warnings have been ordered displayed along the Texas coast by District Forecaster of the Weather Bureau here today. Fresh to strong Southerly winds prevail for a period of twenty-four hours it is said.

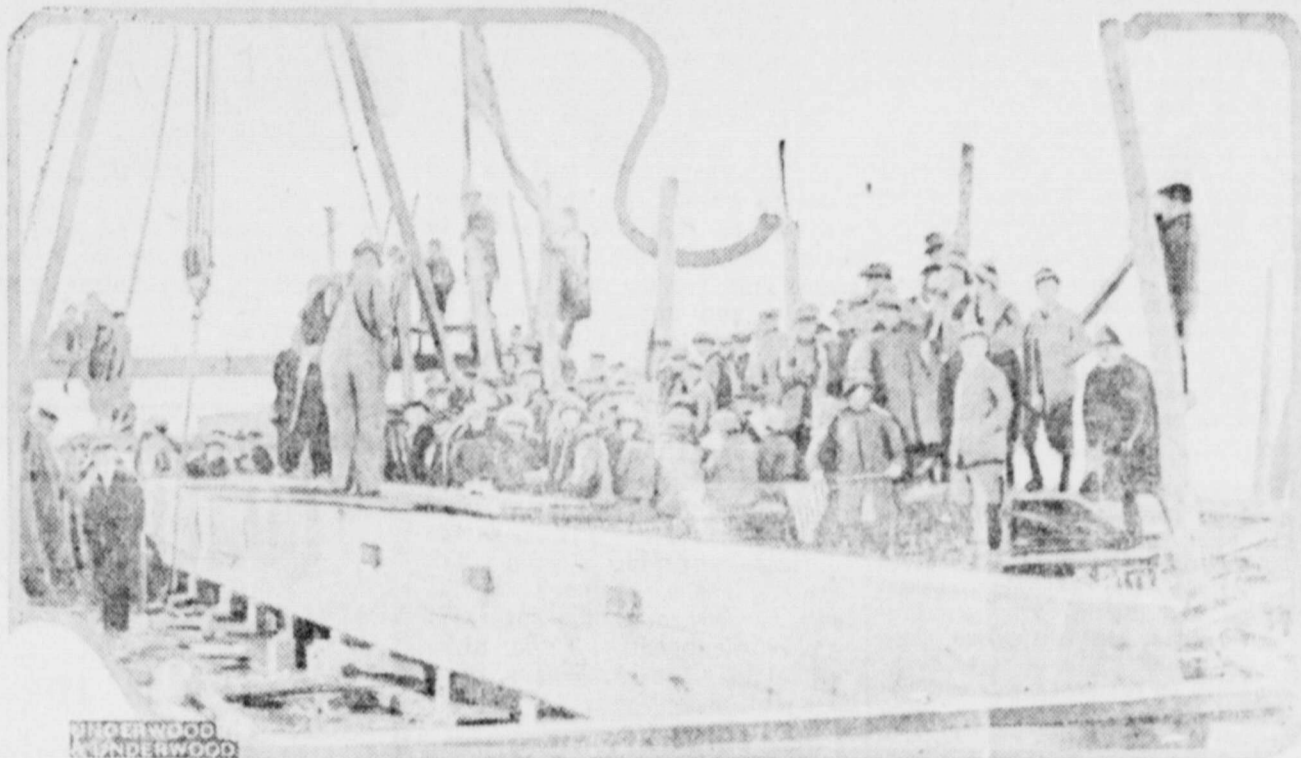

NATIONAL FLYER BILLED AGAIN FOR WHITE SOX TO IN BAD CONDITION THROWING GAME CLOSE UP TOWN

NATCHEZ, Miss., March 26.—Lieut. William Coney, the transcontinental flyer, whose airplane crashed to the ground near Crowville, La., yesterday while attempting to break a record flight from Jacksonville, Fla., to San Diego, California, is today battling for life in a local hospital. Coney was seriously and probably fatally injured when his machine plunged to the ground.

Lieut. Coney recently made a record flight from San Diego to Jacksonville. He was forced to land near Bronte, Texas, on account of engine trouble, but broke records for flying time across the country, and he was attempting to lower his own record when his machine crashed down yesterday.

Over thirty business men of Ballinger have already purchased "meal tickets" for the Retail Merchants "get together" dinner to be held Tuesday evening, March 29th. The committee in charge of affairs expects over fifty to be present, and has asked that those whom they were unable to see, call at the offices of the Y. M. B. L. and secure their tickets. Every retail merchant in the city is expected to be present.

Directors for the new retail merchants' organization will be elected; delegates appointed to attend the state meeting of retail merchants to be held in Brownwood in May, and plans discussed for stimulating local trade conditions, holding feature weeks, special co-operative sales, etc. Those in charge expect much good to result from the meeting.

LITTLE LOSS IN FRIDAY NIGHT'S FIRE

A small storage room at a negro residence in the Southern part of the city was destroyed by fire about one o'clock Friday night. The fire company was called out, but did not run the hose as the fire was confined to the small storage room, and was practically destroyed when the fire fighters arrived. The origin of the fire is unknown.

CHICAGO, March 26.—True bills against eighteen men were voted today by the Cook county grand jury as a result of the second investigation of the alleged throwing of the 1919 world series to Cincinnati by the Chicago White Sox.

The state's attorney announced that true bills, which named the thirteen players indicted in the first investigation last fall, including additional players as follows: Carl Zork, Ben Franklin, Ben Levi, Louis Levi, and Davis Zelser.

LODGE LEADER FOR REPUBLICANS

WASHINGTON, March 26.—Senator Lodge of Massachusetts, will be chairman of the Republican steering committee, as well as Senate floor leader for the majority, according to plans of the Republican organization, which became known today.

Senator McCumber, who was a mild reservationist in the peace treaty controversy, and not in harmony with the majority of the Republicans in that contest, has been given a place on the committee of committees.

RAILROAD FIRES TRAIN PORTERS

PALESTINE, Tex., March 26.—All train porters and messengers on trains on the I. & G. N. railroad were suspended today by orders of the general offices here.

RICH SLACKER SEEKS RELEASE

KANSAS CITY, March 26.—An application for a writ of habeas corpus was brought today by Erwin Bergdoll, the millionaire Philadelphia draft evader, to obtain his release from the Federal disciplinary barracks at Ft. Leavenworth. The application was taken under advisement today by Judge Pollock, after hearing the petition in Federal court.

The merchants of Ballinger are practically unanimous in an agreement to close up shop from one until four o'clock next Thursday afternoon as an effort to increase the attendance at the White Sox baseball game.

There will be a large crowd here for the day, and business will no doubt be pretty good, but there will be little trading during the baseball game, and many of those who could not otherwise attend will have an opportunity to take in the game.

Secretary Williams and President Guin, of the Y. M. B. L., called on the merchants Saturday morning and with very little opposition on the part of any one all agreed to close.

The game is being well advertised. Word from neighboring towns indicate that the attendance from those places will be large. One citizen at Eden, Ed Latham, signed up with the guarantee committee, when he learned that various individuals were underwriting the proposition. All the stock has been placed, and chances are good that no one will have to put up to make good the guarantee for bringing the major league team here.

MEXICAN LOVE GROWING BETTER

AUSTIN, March 26.—Mexican Consul General Eduardo Ruiz, of San Francisco, today told Gov. Neff that the Mexican secret service system which formerly operated in the United States thru various consuls, had been completely suppressed and abandoned. Senor Ruiz is in Austin as a special envoy of President Obregon and conferred with the Texas governor regarding bettering conditions of Mexican laborers in Texas.

NO TRACE OF LOST BALLOON

PENSACOLA, Fla., March 26.—Naval officers today are discouraged at the failure of a two day's search for the missing balloon and five occupants, all of the Naval Air Station here, but have not lost hope of finding the craft.

Airplanes, dirigibles, eagles, boats, and sub chasers are continuing to scour the coast in the vicinity of the place where the balloon was last reported.

SEEK DELAY IN MURDER TRIAL

Judge Culp, attorney for J. H. Boland, charged with the murder of Charley Allen, arrived in Ballinger Friday night from Gameville, and will be present when court convenes Monday.

It is almost certain that the defense will ask for a continuance, according to a statement made by Judge Culp. He stated that Mrs. Boland, wife of defendant, and also the sister of the defendant, would not be able to be present on account of illness. The parties named are the main witnesses for the defense.

This is the only criminal case on the docket for next week, and if a motion for continuance is granted the court will probably dismiss in short order.

It was indicated today that the state would announce ready in the J. H. Boland murder case set for trial here next Monday. District Attorney Early, County Attorney Shepherd and Doss & Baugh represent the state and will handle the prosecution, while the defense will be represented by counsel from his home county in East Texas. A special venire has been called and the state will fight for the death penalty.

Boland is charged with killing Charley Allen, a young farmer, on the latter's farm West of Ballinger last fall.

INDUSTRIAL AGENT VISITS BALLINGER

C. C. French, Industrial Agent for the Fort Worth Stockyards, who is working in this section under the direction of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, visited Ballinger Wednesday and Thursday in the interest of the chamber's move for better bred livestock. The campaign has as its object the feeding out on the farms of Texas grown cattle with cotton seed, meal, grain, sorghums, hay, soudan, etc., raised on West Texas farms.

Mr. French was accompanied by W. C. Cook, of the Extension Service of A. & M. College, who is at the head of the Boys' Club and Baby Beef movement in Texas.

While in the city, Mr. French and Mr. Cook visited the feeding pens conducted by W. O. Shultz, and were warm in their praises of the splendid type of beef cattle being produced in his pens. Mr. Cook made several photos of good beef types for use at the College in their publications.

Instruction in stock judging was given to ten members of Boys Clubs, whose work in this county is conducted by County Agent D. F. Eaton.

TEAM WORKING HARD FOR WHITE SOX GAME

Manager Lusk called out the baseball players here yesterday, and put the men thru a snappy workout for about one hour and thirty minutes. About thirty-five men reported and from all indications every member of the club is going to have to stay on his toes and work hard for a place on the team. The ground is being put into fairly good condition and by Thursday of next week the entire park and grand stand will be ready for the big game with the White Sox.

BERLIN, March 26.—The German government announced today that order had been restored in Eisleben and Hattstadt. The rioters at Hattstadt, however, blew up the railroad station before they retired to the hills near town, where they set up machine guns which are reported to be firing at the securely policed city.

Halle is also reported to be quiet and the municipal utility plants were operating last night. An organization known as the "council of action" is being organized on the battle fields. Government troops have not participated in the operation of suppressing the communists in central Germany, officials declared today. The work of restoring order has been executed by the Prussian security police, and local organizations.

HALLE, Saxony, March 26.—Reinforcement of the communist rioters at Mansfield and Eisleben is progressing today. Armed workmen are moving from the Halle vicinity to join their comrades, who, after many hours of fighting, have been driven back and forced to retreat from Eisleben by the security police.

BERLIN, March 26.—Twenty rioters were killed when the security police at Eisleben repulsed an attack made upon the city hall last night. The police casualties consisted of two killed and three wounded.

OBERROEBLINGEN, Prussian Saxony, March 26.—Reports that the communist forces which have been fighting in Eisleben against the security police for three days, have been driven from the city, were brought here last night by men who were breathless from running twelve miles. The runners said that the communists were retreating across the fields, but were in most part retreating in good order.

GETS NEWS OF HER BROTHER'S DEATH

Mrs. E. V. Bateman received a message Saturday announcing the death of her brother, J. W. Riggins, which occurred in California, where deceased was for the benefit of his health. Mr. Riggins was mayor of Waco for a number of years, and visited Ballinger several times, coming here to see his sister. He suffered a break down in health some time ago. Funeral arrangements had not been announced, but if the remains are brought to Waco for burial Mrs. Bateman will probably attend the funeral.

TEXAS SICK MEN CAN'T GET BEER

While the recent ruling of United States Attorney General Palmer provides that a doctor can prescribe beer for the man with a "weak" constitution, and fixes the limit of beer for any sick individual at approximately sixty gallons per year, or about one and one-eighth gallons per week, there is little consolation in the ruling for the Texas sick men.

Mr. Palmer ruled on the Volstead Act, and even though Secretary Mellon should approve the ruling, which must be done before the doctor can take on this "side-line practice," it must be remembered that Texas is living under the Dean Act, which in many ways is a stronger bar to beer drinking than the national law.

There are only ten states in the union which might take advantage of the Palmer ruling and begin beer brewing again. Eight of the beer states are located in the East, and California and Louisiana making up the other two, and before a man becomes ill enough to demand beer for his "stomach's sake" he will have to move to one of the "health resort" states.

Since Palmer's ruling on beer has been made public it's likely that thirst will be considered a further use for it. — Detroit News.

Famous Paintings of Our Savior's Agony and Death

It seems fitting that at Easter time one's thoughts should turn to the art galleries which contain the famous paintings portraying the crucifixion and resurrection of our Savior. For generations most of them have hung upon the walls of museums of Europe and have been an inspiration not only to lovers of art, but to all Christians as well who have studied and admired the conception of the artist and the manner in which that conception has been portrayed on the canvas.

RUBENS.

One of the world's most noted paintings showing Christ on the Cross is by Peter Paul Rubens. It has but the one figure—the dying Christ, hanging on the cross. The background is dark, the sky being almost black, which brings out more fully the real beauty and richness of the work. The head of Christ has fallen against the right arm and a peaceful expression is on the face, showing that the agony has passed. The body has sagged and the muscles of the arms are prominent. Blood trickles from the nail holes in the hands and feet, while that from the wound in the side has dripped on the loin cloth, which is draped in graceful fashion. The figure is well drawn, being a perfectly natural form of a tall slender man of the age of Christ at the time of His crucifixion.

Rubens painted many pictures of the Christ, but this one is by far the most striking and beautiful. He was the chief master of the Flemish school of painting, and was one of the most versatile artists of all times. Beginning the study of art early in life he worked under many famous painters, particularly in Venice and Rome. He was a man of scholarly attainments, speaking six languages, and was intimately acquainted with nearly every ruler in Europe, the majority of whom gave him commissions for pictures. He died at Antwerp in 1640.

DURER.

Another great canvas showing Christ on the Cross is the work of Albrecht Durer, and like the one of Rubens shows only the figure of the Savior. The background is an almost inky cloud with the fading sunset sky near one foot of the cross, and a few trees standing in the foreground. The figure is stretched on the cross and there is no wound in the side, the only blood showing being a few drops of the right hand. The body has sagged slightly and the loin cloth flutters in the wind. The crown of thorns is pressed down on the head, the sweet and face is upraised, the eyes are turned toward heaven in the agony, and the mouth slightly opened as if He were in the act of speaking. The real beauty of the canvas is in the face of Christ, and it has never been excelled in its sweet, spiritual portrayal. The painting hangs in the National gallery at Dresden.

Durer was born at Nuremberg in 1471. At an early age he displayed great talent in drawing and in 1485 his father apprenticed him to the great painter, Wolschgenuth, with whom he studied several years. Later he studied in Venice and traveled to all the art centers, where he made friends with the most noted men of his time, being particularly friendly with Martin Luther. His coloring is faultless and the faces, especially in his religious pictures, are regarded as almost sublime in their dignity. He was a man of great piety and in sympathy with the reformation movement. He died in 1528.

FRA ANGELICO DA FIESOLE.

Still another Christ on the Cross stands out in the art world—that canvas by Fra Angelico da Fiesole, a circular picture, which hangs in the Academy at Florence.

His Christ on the Cross is considered by art connoisseurs as one of his best. It contains three figures, the Christ on the Cross, the Virgin and

the Magdalen. Christ, wearing the crown of thorns, hangs on the cross. His head surrounded by a curious fan-shaped golden halo with three red stripes. The face shows sadness and is well drawn. The picture is rich in color, the background being a blue sky of the most vivid shade. The blood on the hands, side and feet which trickles down in three straight streams is a brilliant red, forming a strong contrast to the sky.

MURILLO.

Ecce Homo (Behold the Man), by Murillo, is regarded by many as the most beautiful painting of Christ in existence. This artist is noted for the sweetness of his faces, always with a touch of sadness, and in this he has excelled himself, for the whole makeup of the picture is sublime. A simple head of the Christ wearing the crown of thorns. The clear cut nose, delicate mouth and lowered eyes portray a pathos and spirituality rarely found on canvas. The background is dark brown, while the robe is a rich red. The painting hangs in the Prado gallery at Madrid.

Murillo was born in Seville in 1617 and although a poor boy became the chief master of the School of Seville. His early life was a struggle and it was not until after he married a lady of wealth that he was able to carry out his work to perfection. He painted many religious pictures, especially madonnas and scenes of the crucifixion. He died in 1682.

SOLARIO.

Ecce Homo (Behold the Man) by Andrea Solario, presents an entirely different conception of Christ. A bleeding head crowned with thorns is against a black background. The red robe has fallen from one shoulder, leaving the arm and part of the chest nude. The hands are tied together, one holding a long thin pointed stick. The face is almost stern with its tightly drawn mouth. The eyes are lowered and there is a tear drop falling from the left one. Indeed so remarkable is this painted tear drop that people stand fascinated before the picture, some of them declaring it is a real tear. The face shows the Man in deep thought. The picture is in the gallery at Milan and is by far the most striking of the entire collection.

Andrea Solario, who is responsible for the work, was a painter of Milan, born in 1490. He studied in Venice for a time and on his return to Milan fell under the influence of Leonardo da Vinci and was sent by the latter to complete some of the former's work for Cardinal d'Amboise. His work was so like that of da Vinci, both in drawing and coloring, that it is sometimes difficult to tell it apart. Ecce Homo, his masterpiece, was painted in 1515, shortly before his death.

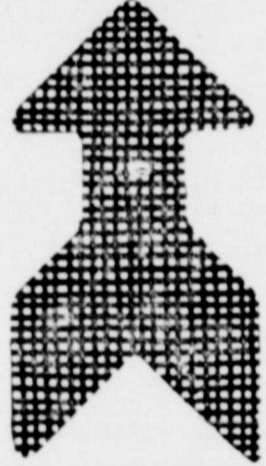

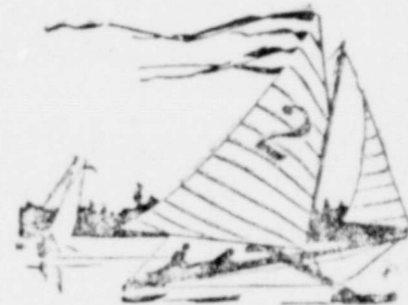
