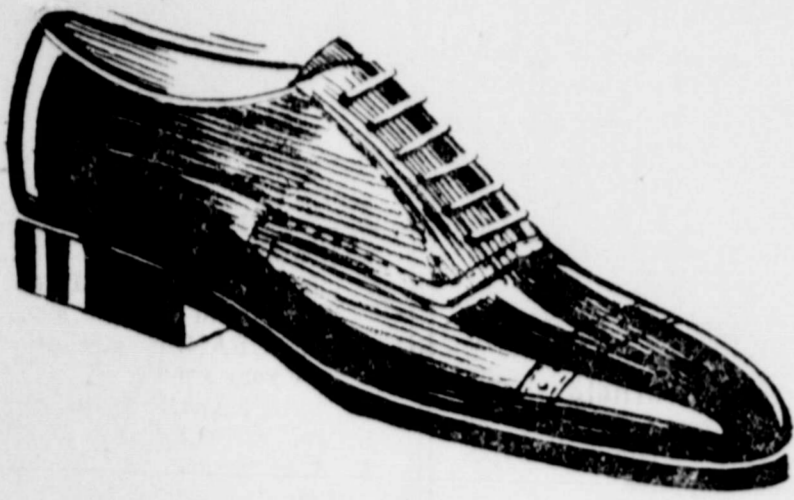

FARMERS WANT CHANCE TO HELP THEMSELVES

FORMER CITIZEN APPOINTED ASST. U. S. ATTORNEY

WICHITA FALLS, April 20.—United States District Attorney Henry Zweifel announced today that he had tendered his first assistant's position to Attorney Lawrence Harris, of San Angelo. Mr. Harris is the son of Judge C. O. Harris, a prominent attorney and Texas Republican.

Lawrence Harris was born and raised in Ballinger. He was admitted to the bar here and later moved to San Angelo with his father, several years ago. Judge Harris came to Ballinger in the early days, and for many years was county attorney of this county, altho a Republican being elected on the Democratic ticket in the early days when the lines were not drawn so tight, and when a man's political faith did not cut much figure when it came to election of county officers. Lawrence has many friends in Ballinger who will be glad to note his advancement in the professional and political world.

GERMANS WILL MAKE OFFER

PARIS, April 20.—According to the Daily Temps today Germany will, on next Wednesday or Thursday, propose to pay to the allies three billion gold marks during ten years, and also make yearly payments amounting to one-fifth of German exports to allied countries during the preceding years.

The newspaper states that, in order to realize part of the above payments Germany proposes to issue an international loan of ten billion gold marks upon which she is preparing to pay interest up to five per cent.

The Temps comments on the proposition as follows: "Berlin is convinced that the proposition will be rejected by the allies, but insists on presenting them publicly, hoping that a certain part of the opinion abroad will consider them sufficient to bring pressure to bear on the allies, to prevent the allies if possible from occupying the Ruhr region as a means of forcing the reparations fixed by the allies."

LAW REPEALED; CASE DISMISSED

AUSTIN, April 20.—A repeal of the minimum wage law by the Thirty-seventh Legislature was the basis for dismissing the case against J. Pope, convicted in Harris county for violating this act. Pope appealed to the Court of Criminal Appeals, and when the case came up for hearing today the court dismissed it.

WASHINGTON, April 20.—Representative farmers who are in conference here today looking to betterment of domestic problems, and who came from all parts of the United States, decided to take their fight for a reduction in freight rates direct to President Harding. Mr. Harding will be petitioned to present some solution of the high freight rate problem to Congress.

WASHINGTON, April 20.—Farmers from various sections of the country, affiliated with the National Farmers' Union, gathered here today for a three days conference to discuss problems affecting their welfare.

The meeting was called by Charles S. Barrett, president of the union, with a view of giving the farmers an opportunity of expressing their own opinions on domestic problems and pending or projected legislation.

At the opening of the conference Mr. Barrett urged the creation of a joint congressional committee to inquire into and suggest remedial measures for the agricultural situation.

He declared that agriculture in American was rapidly going toward the habitat of the "halt, lame and blind," and asserted "what agriculture wants is an opportunity to help itself." Mr. Barrett declared that agriculture would not need the aid of any organization, if the shackles are thrown off and the great agricultural industry of the country given an opportunity to help itself and not be forced to depend on other agencies.

COURT AFFIRMS SWINDLE CASE

AUSTIN, April 20.—The ten year sentence of John Gerber, convicted in Tarrant county as being an accomplice in the Norfleet \$40,000 swindle case, was affirmed in the Court of Criminal Appeals today.

Norfleet, of Hale county, was swindled out of \$40,000 by several men, claiming to be representatives of Dallas and Fort Worth cotton exchanges. The men claimed to be on the inside of the market and induced Norfleet to put up his money. Norfleet trailed the men across the continent, and finally captured one of them in Florida, and the man attempted to escape by jumping from the train window while he was being carried back to Ft. Worth.

JAP PROBLEM WANTS PROGRAM

WASHINGTON, April 20.—Senators and Congressmen of eleven far Western states today perfected an organization with a view of finding some common ground upon which to work in solving the question of Japanese immigration. This question, which has worried Congress for several years grows more menacing with the influx of Japs to the Western coast states which continue to appeal to the government for some protection.

Senator Johnson, of California, chairman of the committee, decided to appoint an executive committee of one Senator and one Representative from each of the eleven states: California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Oklahoma and Colorado, to work out some program for handling the question.

JAPAN DECLINES ALTER MANDATE

TOKIO, April 20.—The local press today stated that the Japanese cabinet decided yesterday that there is no reason to alter Japan's policy on the Yap mandate question because of the recent American note on the subject. Reports state that the decision of the ministry will be presented Friday to an extraordinary meeting of the diplomatic advisory council.

COLD WEATHER SAID TO BE CRIPPLING GRAIN

It is believed by many of the farmers that cold weather, and not a lack of rain altogether, is responsible for the deterioration in the grain crop. Reports received here indicate that the crop has gone to the bad in some localities during the present month, and what was promising prospects in the month of March are not now so promising. Farmers claim that there is plenty of moisture in the ground to bring up crops, and that while a good rain would help small grain, that cold seems to be the principal cause for the falling off. It was warm when it should have been cold, and the weather for the past three weeks has been a little out of season. Despite the complaints farmers say that considerable grain will be made, and that in some localities the prospects are better than others.

LIQUOR MOVING LAW HELD GOOD

AUSTIN, April 20.—The Court of Criminal Appeals again handed down another ruling on the Dean liquor law, and in a decision rendered today holds that the transportation feature of the Dean act is constitutional.

The decision came when the court passed on the application for a writ of habeas corpus and denied the writ in the Leopold Garcia case. Garcia was convicted for transporting liquor from one place to another and sent up from Williamson county for one year in the pen.

The application for a writ of habeas corpus presented in Garcia's behalf claimed that the Dean law was unconstitutional in that the Eighteenth amendment to the Federal constitution overrules it.

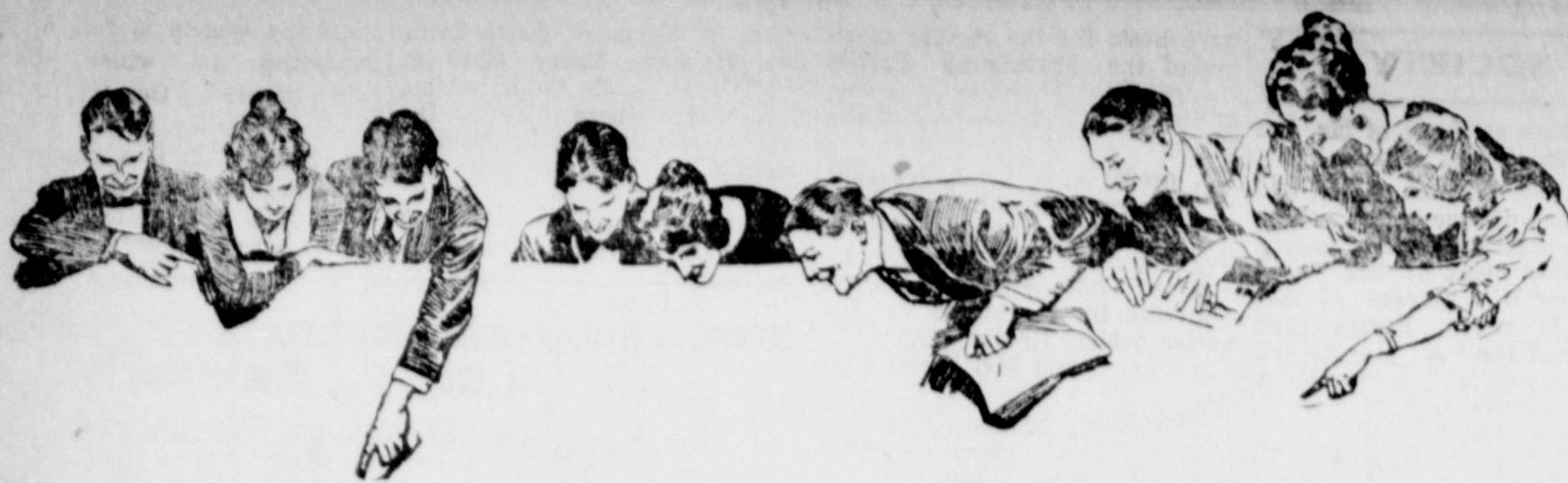

CREWS COMMUNITY TO GET NEW MAIL ROUTE

By going around the world, many of the citizens of the Crews country, who have been getting their mail at Crews, will receive mail daily on a route established out of Novice. Crews receives its mail now by way of Winters, and the train schedule and the Crews mail carrier's schedule do not correspond and mail reaches patrons served out of the Crews office late.

A route has been extended out of Novice which penetrates the Crews country, and a number of people have instructed that mail be directed to them over the new route.

This works a hardship on people in the Crews country who have business to transact in Ballinger by mail, but gives them a daily delivery from the North. Under the new route a letter addressed to Crews must go on to Coleman, and from there up to the Santa Fe to Novice and then on the route from Novice, making a hundred miles trip to get twenty miles.

The same thing applies to the patrons of the Norton, Marie and

Maverick communities, who transact business at Ballinger by mail. Mail from here is directed around by San Angelo, up the Orient to Bronte, and then out by motor mail route to Maverick and Norton, making another hundred mile haul to get eighteen or twenty miles, and all at a delay and cost to the patrons of those post offices.
