LONDON, April 23.—Germany ent to Washington today reply to the American note in which the United States rejected to act in the role of arbitrator for the reparations question between Germany and the allies, according to Central News dispatches received here from Berlin.

The note was sent to President Harding, but its terms were not divulged to party leaders up to noon, and the contents will not be made known until late today.


