



LONDON, May 6 .- The Brit. ish overseas dominions would not tolerate an Anglo-Japanese alliance, having as its object opposition to the United States, declared the London Weekly Spectator today. The newspaper devoted considerable space to a discussion of the Anglo-American relations and Japan, citing facts to show that the alliance between England and Japan was never meant and never could be used against America.

BRIDGE CLOSED FOR FINAL WORK

Sunday afternoon from three to special agent. five o'clock during the dedication ceremonies, the bridge will be thrown open permanently.

The cement work on the bridge was completed some time ago and the public permitted to use the bridge until the asphalt could arrive for the floor covering. The contractors are running the asphalt today and it will require only a few hours for it to harden.




