ABILENE, May 20 .- A verdict of guilty, with the penalty fixed at fifty, years in the state penitentiary, was returned here by the jury this morning against Albert L. Rowan tried in the district court here on a change of venue for the murder of G. W. Street, a Dallas postal clerk, who was killed in the robbery of the Jackson street sub-station last January.
