REDWOOD, Calif., May 26.—Captain Eddie Rickenbacker, the American "ace," left here at daybreak today for what he hopes to be a record flight from this point to Washington, D. C. He expects to reach Omaha, Nebraska, at eight o'clock tonight and will attempt to arrive at Washington Friday night.

The flight is being made in the interest of the American Legion. Captain Rickenbacker took the air at 8:32. It his second attempt to get away today. The first attempt was stopped by a thick fog.

U. S. LOSES IN GOLF GAMES

HOY LAKE, England, May 26.—The United States was finally forced out of the British amateur golf championship at the end of the sixth round early this afternoon, when Frederick J. Wright, of Boston, the sole survivor of the American entrants, was defeated by Benard Darwin in a sensational finish. Darwin's victory was the cause of great rejoicing among the Britishers in a crowd of two thousand spectators who witnessed America's defeat.

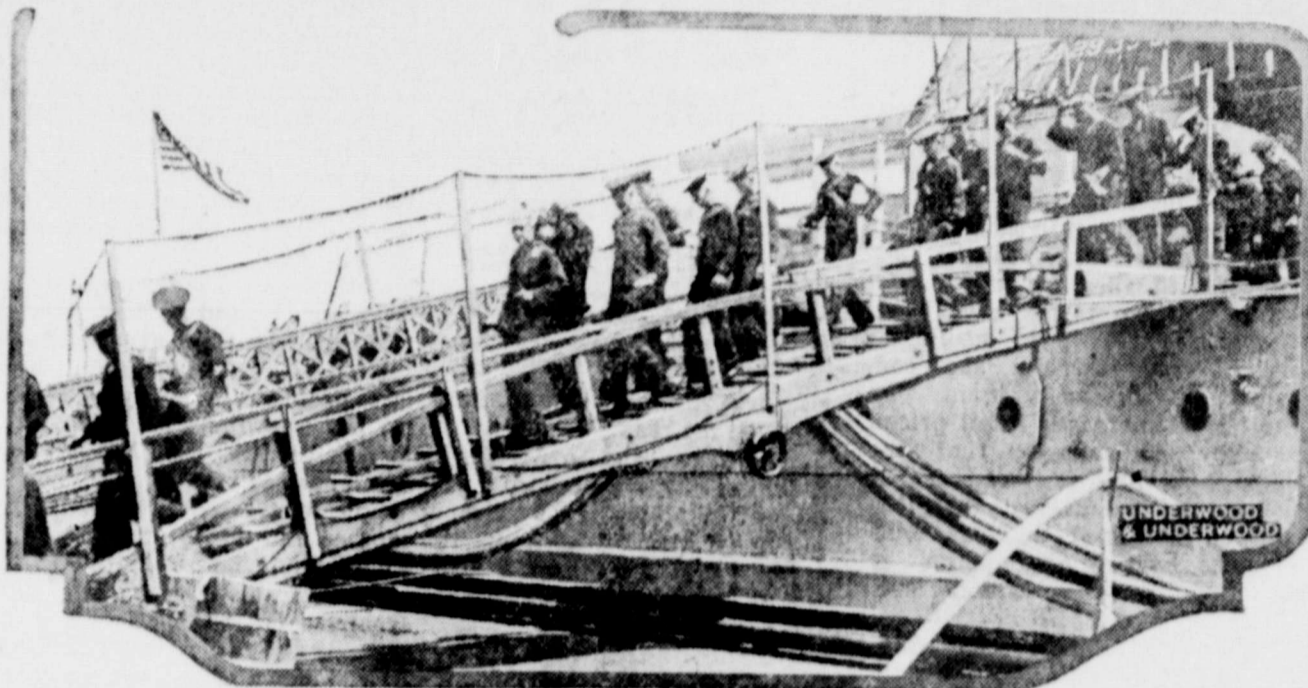

LOAN TO ALLIES TO BE FUNDED

WASHINGTON, May 26.—Foreign loans approximating one million dollars, made to the allies during the war, will be funded this year, Secretary Mellon said today. Accumulated interest which remains unpaid will probably be funded also, the secretary said, and payments will be spread over a period of years. In converting the loans into a permanent investment the matter will be made easier on the allies.

In commenting on President Harding's recent New York speech, in which the president expressed the hope that the present form of foreign obligations might be changed into a reasonable period and distributed among people of the nation, Mellon said no plan of that kind had yet been formulated.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING PRESBYTERIAN CHURCHES

The congregations of the two local Presbyterian churches have been called to meet at their respective churches next Sunday morning at eleven o'clock. Business of importance to the cause of Christianity and Presbyterianism in Ballinger will come before the two religious bodies, and it is important that every member of the churches be present at their respective church. There will be preaching at both churches preceding the congregational meeting.

LONDON, May 26.—American ammunition totalling 16,388 rounds, has been captured in the Dublin district of Ireland since March 26th, Sir Hamar Greenwood, chief secretary of Ireland, stated before the House of Commons today.

TURKS AND RUSS STOCKMAN OUT AGREE ON TREATY ON \$10,000 BOND

ATHENS, May 26.—The soviet of Russia and the Turkish nationalist government have agreed upon a treaty based on mutual aid for the "emancipation of all peoples of the East and the absolute right of self government" it was announced here today.

The treaty as agreed upon denounces all pacts or conventions imposed by force upon the Turkish nation. Batum is given to Georgia and Azerbaijan is made an autonomous state. Russia releases Turkey from all economic engagements predating the soviet.

HOUSTON, May 26.—The first bale of the 1921 cotton crop was shipped from San Benito today by E. Matz. The bale was consigned to a Houston cotton firm, and will be placed in the block and sold to the highest bidder.

TALKS POLICY FOR EXPORTING

WASHINGTON, May 26.—The administration's policy in promoting exportation as a means of restoration of normal business conditions, was discussed at the White House dinner last night. The dinner was attended by Secretary Mellon, Secretary Hoover, J. P. Morgan, Paul Warburg, and a number of other prominent financiers.

President Harding was said to have talked the whole matter over with his guests.

SHOOTS SELF SEATED IN AUTO

GALVESTON, May 26.—Miss Doris Stephens, age nineteen years old believed to have been a resident of Humble, Texas, died in an ambulance en route to a local hospital today from self-inflicted pistol wounds.

The young lady shot herself while seated in an automobile in the business section of the city about one o'clock this morning.

GILLETT ELECTED CAPTAIN VARSITY BASEBALL CLUB

AUSTIN, May 26.—Ira W. (Bass) Gillett, of Alpine, Texas, has been elected captain of the 1922 baseball team of the University of Texas. Gillett was the mainstay of the Longhorn pitching staff this year. He is a junior in the university and has played on the baseball team every year he has been at Austin. He has not lost a game in the three years and pitched a no-run game against the Texas A & M. College each of the last two years.

REAR ADMIRAL DEAD

WASHINGTON, May 26.—Rear Admiral Augustus F. Fehltel, commandant of the Fifth Naval District, died at Norfolk navy yards today, according to reports to the navy department. He had been ill several months.

HOUSES PASSES DEFICIENCY BILL

WASHINGTON, May 26.—The one hundred million dollar deficiency appropriation bill, carrying two hundred thousand dollars for the enforcement of prohibition laws until July first, was passed by the House today.

OKLA. EDITOR TO SPEAK HERE

Carl Williams, Editor of the Oklahoma City Daily Oklahoman, and one of the most prominent farmers in the Southwest, will speak at Ballinger on June 4th at 2:00 p. m.

Mr. Williams is making a tour of Texas in the interest of the cotton contract pool of the Farm Bureau. He is the man who did so much towards putting over the proposition in Oklahoma, bringing that state up to its full quota. He is a good speaker and it is expected that a large number of farmers will hear him here on June 4th.

MAKING SURVEY DOWN COLORADO

H. E. Petty, whose farm is located about 2 1/2 miles South-east of Maverick, reports that the U. S. Geological Engineers reached his place Wednesday with the survey which they are running down the river from the proposed damsite.

They gave the elevation of Mr. Petty's farm as 1795. In response to an inquiry by Mr. Petty as to what they thought about the irrigation project, the surveyors stated that the Chief said that "it was the best project that he had ever seen." Mr. Petty gave them considerable assistance while they were in his neighborhood, in locating roads, streams, etc.

Engineers are evidently surveying out the irrigable area.

Mr. Petty is an enthusiastic booster for the irrigation scheme and a firm believer in its possibilities. Since the State and Federal engineers got on the job the citizens residing with in the proposed irrigation area are placing more confidence in the proposition, and are eager to lend what aid they can towards the success of the work.

THE TRUTH

The Comanche county grand jury makes an ugly showing for that county by returning 63 bills—26 felonies and 39 misdemeanors, but it sounds a note of warning which should be heeded by parents not only in Comanche county, but everywhere. The grand jury in its report says:

"We have been put to considerable trouble and unnecessary time on account of witnesses in some instances being reluctant to testify about matters of which they are fully acquainted, and in some cases it is very hard to impress upon the witnesses the importance of testifying truthfully; in a great number of cases, especially among young men. They don't seem to realize the importance of telling the truth about which they are interrogated. As a matter of suggestion, we would respectfully ask that the parents and teachers over the country try to impress upon their children and pupils the importance of telling the truth at all times, and on all occasions."

The grand jury's recommendations is a whole sermon in a few words. Telling a little lie may not harm much to begin with, but it leads to serious crimes as it sears the conscience, and then too the man who will lie to shield crime is a criminal to that extent.

Within five minutes after the local charity committee had turned her down, and after the city authorities had informed her that she could not beg on the streets of Ballinger, a woman called at a local jewelry store Wednesday and asked to be shown some diamonds. She stated that she wanted to buy about a two hundred dollar stone.

The woman appeared to be partly paralyzed, using a crutch and also carrying a crippled hand. She began her work on the streets, but was soon informed that she was going contrary to the laws of this city and directed to the charity committee, where she was informed that her case was not such as to deserve aid from the local charity board.

The Ledger would not say anything or do anything that would cause anyone to withhold aid from an unfortunate who needed help, but the public has been imposed upon from time to time, and so much money has been in a manner wasted, that it is high time for some systematic plan to be adopted for dealing with beggars.

Any worthy object of charity will find a willing hand in this city. Ballinger people are charitable to a fault, and the sympathy for the unfortunate is shown whenever a call is made for aid, but money expended in supporting imposters should be conserved for the worthy causes which confront us from time to time.

When once the outside world learns that Ballinger's gates are

closed good and tight to such a class of people, and that grafters will not be permitted to ply their trade here, they will save railroad fare and hotel bills, and this city will be kept free of such imposters. You can aid in keeping them out by referring them to the proper authority when they call on you.

NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held at the City Hall in the town of Ballinger within the Ballinger Independent School District, on the 7th day of June 1921, to determine whether the Bonds of said District shall be issued to the amount of Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) payable Forty (40) Years from their date and bearing interest at the rate of Five (5%) per cent per annum, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a few stone or concrete building and repairing old buildings and there shall be annually levied, assessed and collected on all the taxable property in said district for the current year and annually thereafter while said bonds or any of them are outstanding, a tax sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

And further, to determine whether the Board of Trustees of said District shall have the power to annually levy and collect a tax on all the taxable property, in said district, for the support and maintenance of public free schools in said Ballinger Independent School District of and at the rate of not exceeding Sixty-Five (65) cents on the One Hundred Dollar valuation of all taxable property in said District, as provided by the general laws of the regular session of the Thirty-Seventh Legislature, commonly known as the "Enabling Act, House Bill No. 118, approved by the Governor, March 5, 1921, passed pursuant to amend Section 3 of Article 7 of the constitution of Texas.

J. F. Lusk has been appointed manager of said election which shall be held as nearly as may be possible in conformity with the general election laws of the State.

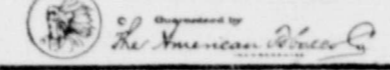
No person shall vote at said election unless he be a qualified voter under the constitution and laws of this State, and a taxpayer in said Ballinger Independent School District.

Those in favor of the issuance of the Bonds and the levying of the Tax shall write or print on their ballots, "For the Bonds and the Tax," and those against the issuance of the Bonds and the levying of the Tax, shall write or print on their ballots, "Against the Bonds and the Tax."

Those in favor of levying and collecting of a Tax not exceeding Sixty-Five (65) cents on the One Hundred (\$100) Dollar valuation of property in said District shall write or print on their ballots, "For the Tax," and those against the levying and collecting of such Tax, shall

CHINESE OATH REQUIRES CHICKEN AU NATUREL

EL PASO, May 26.—Wong Dew Foy was charged with importing Wong Wun and Wong Sai Ting into the United States. They all testified before United States Commissioner A. J. W. Schmid. C. M. Counts, attorney for the trio, declared their testimony was not valid because they had not taken the oath of the court in Chinese fashion—over the flowing blood of a chicken.

The Chinese said it was their custom to take oaths as the blood was flowing from a chicken, but the commissioner said that he didn't have time to run down a chicken and kill it in his court, just to administer an oath and that if a Chinese or anybody else held up his right hand in his court and swore "I do," he would assume that the witness meant what he said.

Chinese frequently appear in the commissioner's court in cases of alleged importation of aliens, illegal entry into the United States or narcotic smuggling, but never before had one of their attorneys suggested that they be required to take oath in Chinese style.

WOMEN QUERY STATE HEALTH OFFICIALS

AUSTIN, May 26.—Women keep the State Board of Health busy solving their home problems, such as how to keep a husband's love and how to make their spouses give up "hooch" and home-brew, according to Dr. Manton M. Carriek, State Health Officer. And men, too, flood the health officer with questions.

One man wrote, asking if water containing iron was injurious, the nature of his letter indicating that he had dropped a rusty horseshoe in the well. Another asked for a formula to kill "a small insect" that was bothering his chickens. Various and divers questions come from men over the state daily, but the more unanswerable queries come from women, the department officials said.

"How can I make my husband love me," and "My husband drinks more than ever since prohibition, how can I stop him," are problems recently submitted to the guardians of the public health for solution. Another woman complained of her nephew being mistreated by his stepmother and wrote at great length about the "sweet little thing" and how his stepmother mistreated him. She quoted a woman living next door and told how she had witnessed the cruelty.

Other seekers of advice swamp the department with questions about livestock, babies, husbands, wives, sisters, daughters, and every other members of the family; how they can be made to cease doing such-and-such and why they do this and why they won't do that. Water-drinking water comes in for its part; food and clothing rank along the top—what kind of food to feed babies and what kind of clothes to wear.

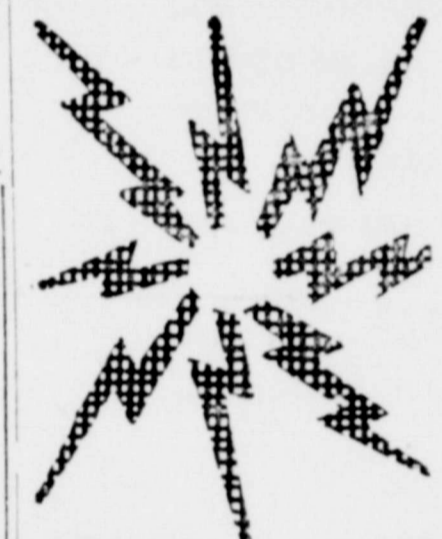

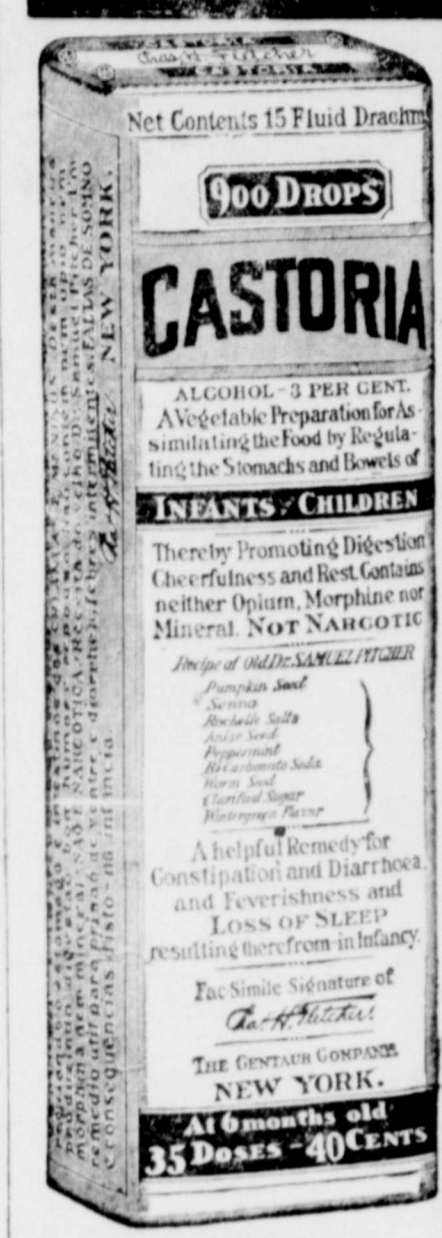

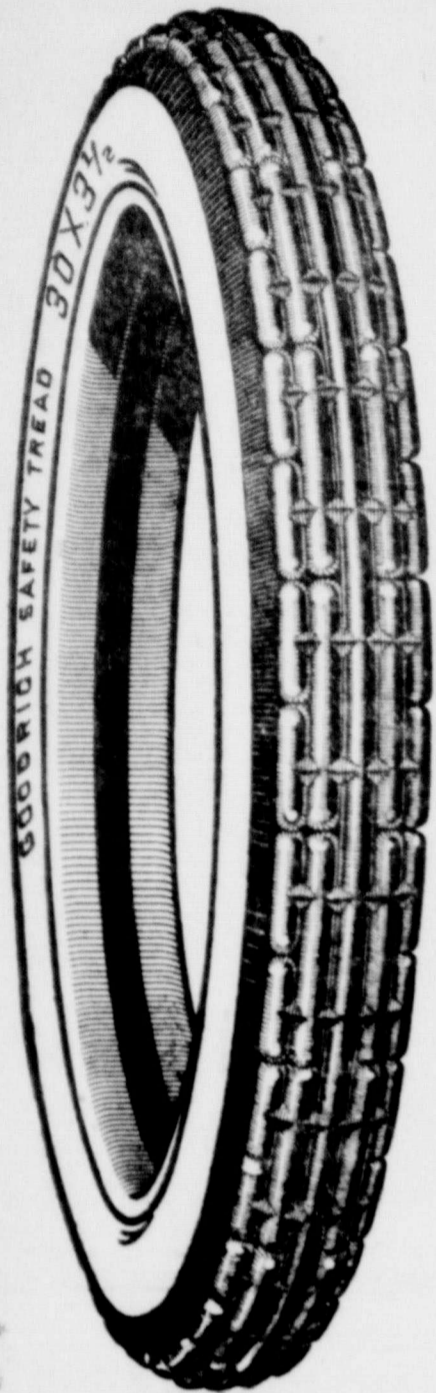
