M'CORMICK COMPLAINS OF SIMS

WASHINGTON, June 8. -Senator McCormick, Republican, of Illinois, complained formally today to President Harding and Secretary Denby about the address in London yesterday of Rear Admiral Sims, in which the naval commander discussed the Irish question.

The Senator asked Mr. Denby to take disciplinary measures against the Admiral. McCormick did not see the president in person but asked that Secretary Christian call the address to the attention of the executive. Sims denounced "American hyphenates" before the English Speak ing Union yesterday.





GIVE CREDIT TO PHOENICIANS

Scientists Believe That Race Erected the Immense Monoliths Found in Various Places.

Glant monoliths standing strangely alone in many places on the globe when discovered by intrepid explorers and adventurers during the recent centuries, are being referred to as the greatest mysteries of human history by archeologists, who are now trying to determine what race built them. 

The Abilene Eagles and Ballinger Bearcats got a rest Monday due to the muddy condition of the grounds as a result of Sunday night's rain.






