





A physician had been not ified to hurry out and meet the party on the road, but the boy was dead when the doctor reached them and the bereaved father returned home with his dead son. Death resulted quicker than ever known before from a snake bite in West Texas, and the quick effect of the poison was due to the fact that the snake's fangs planted the venom in an artery. The remains of the unfortunate boy were laid to rest in the Concho cemetery, near where he was bitten, Tuesday afternoon.
