

RATTLE SNAKE **BITE KILLS BOY**

Felix Halfmann, twelve year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Halfmann, died at his home ten miles South of Ballinger at eight o'clock Wednesday morning as the result of rattle snake bite. The boy was bitten by the snake while at work in the field chopping cotton on July Fourth. He was given hurried medical attention and everything possible to save his life was done, but the venom gained such headway in the boy's system that the little fellow could not throw it off. and death resulted.

This is the second boy killed by snake bite in the Southern part of the county recently, the fourteen years old son of Mr. and Mrs. Dave Ransbarger being killed we weeks ago, dying m an hour and a half from the time he was bitten.






