EL PASO, July 11 .- Preliminary hearings of Charles Robinson, fireman on the Southern Pacific railroad, who is being held in connection with the death of Engineer W. F. Bohlman last Friday near Alpine, when a freight engine exploded, are in progress here. Robinson will be questioned until it is learned where Bohlman was killed, railroad officials announced this afternoon.

Fireman Robinson was four mlies from the train when the engine expladed, and it was at first reported that Engineer Bohlman was killed in the explosion, but knocked from his engine.
