silver, golde and silke laces, girdles, hat bands, etc., hath therefore ordered that no person, either man or woman, shall hereafter make or buy apparell, either woolen, silke or lynnen, with any lace on it, silver, golde silke or threed, under the penalty of the forfecture of such cloathes.

"Provided, and it is the meaning of this court that men and women shall have liberty to weare out such apparell as they are nowe provided of, except the immoderate greate sleeves, slashed apparell, immoderate greate rayles, long wings, etc.

"This order to take place a fortnight after the publishing thereof."
