KINGMAN, Ariz., July 26.— Lem Smith, of Brownwood, Texas, whose body was found by the road side nine miles East of Topock yesterday, was shot in the back of the head, according to word received here today. man by the name of West, also of Brownwood, who passed thru Kingman last Saturday night with Smith, is missing.

BROWNWOOD, July 26. News of the finding of the body of Lem Smith near Kingman, Arizona, was received here Monday. Smith and a man by the name of West left here about two weeks ago for a trip overland in a Ford car, to points West. Smith had been living here for quite a while and had a good reputation. West came here a short time ago and formed a friendship with Smith, and the two planned a trip West.






