SAYS DISCORD MOSTLY BAILEY ECHOES

Senator J. H. Baugh came in from Austin Friday night to spend a day or two at home looking after business which demanded his attention. He returned to Austin Monday.

Senator Baugh stated that there is not as much discord between the legislature and the governor as one would judge from reading the press distatches. "It is mostly echoes of Joe Bailey, said Judge Baugh, "and the legislature is working faithfully to cut expenses and get through in the allotted time.

"You would have no idea of the pressure which is coming for economy," said the Senator, and when asked where the pressure was coming from the Runnels county representative said 'from all over Texas."

Judge Baugh stated that there was danger in the reaction going too far, and the strong pressure being brought to bear on the law makers might cause cutting of important appropriations.






