U. S. ARMAMENT DELEGATES MEET

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—A month of careful preparation for the United States government's part in the disarmament conference began here today. The first meeting of the four delegates selected by President Harding to represent the United States in the conference, met for a caucus and to agree upon plans for speaking for the American government on questions to be discussed at the conference.

The American delegates will go into the conference well posted on every question to come before the conference and will know beforehand what is the best stand for the United States to take on such questions.

It was made known that the formulation of policies begun today by the American delegation would be pursued. Some hint of President Harding's hopes of the conference was given as the delegates were assembling this morning by the publication of a letter which he had written in reply to a prayer that he work for "universal disarmament." "Absolute disarmament," said the president's letter, "was beyond hope of realization, and perhaps very desirable, but reasonable limitation of armament was the practical proposition with some hope of accomplishment."

Similar sentiments were expressed by the military and naval authorities, who concerned themselves with the preparation of data before today's meeting. It is understood that the first consideration of those familiar with the international situation has been for a reasonable limitation of future armament construction rather than for a sealing down of the present strength.

GIANTS CAPTURE SEVENTH GAME

POLO GROUNDS, New York, Oct. 12.—The uncovered bleachers were packed to their capacity by noon today and the largest crowd of the series saw the Giants take the lead over the Yankees in the world's series by a score of 2 to 1. Columbus Day brought out a real holiday crowd with favorable weather prevailing.

"Shufflin'" Phil Douglass pitching for the McGraw Nationals yielded more hits than did Carl Mays hurling for the Yanks, but the Giants punched the apple at the time which counted, and took advantage of one error which the American League champs made.

As the series now stands the Giants have four games to their credit and the Yankees three. If the Giants win tomorrow they will capture the world's championship, while if the Yankees take the game it will be necessary to play the ninth game of the series.

STILL RAIDED, MAN KILLED

MINEOLA, Tex., Oct. 12.—Tom Painter was shot and instantly killed late yesterday when Sheriff Pat Oliver of Rains county, and two prohibition enforcement officers raided a still seven miles Northwest of Alba, in Wood county.

The officers said Painter and other men at the still resisted arrest of their companions.

JURY PROBING LORENA CLASH

WACO, Oct. 12.—The special session of the McLennan county grand jury called by Judge Jas. Meares to investigate the Lorena Ku Klux tragedy, convened this morning. The judge instructed the jury to probe the occurrence thoroughly without fear or favor and fix the blame where it belonged.

Prof. John F. Priddy superintendent of the Wingate school, was in the city Wednesday, having just returned from a trip to Austin, where he went with County Superintendent Bugg on business, and for the purpose of working for classification of his school. Mr. Priddy ordered The Daily Ledger to come to the Wingate school, taking advantage of the special seven months' offer made to the schools of the county.

MILLER'S TRIAL AT BROWNWOOD

The grand jury at Paint Rock Wednesday morning returned a indictment against Sheriff Bob Miller of Concho county, charging him with the murder of Tom Benge. Judge J. O. Woodward immediately transferred, on his own motion, the case to Brownwood, and set the date of the trial for December 5th. Mr. Miller was placed under \$7,000 bond.

Due to the notoriety which has been given the case on account of the trouble of long standing between Miller and Benge, it was predicted that the court would experience trouble in getting a jury in Concho county, and it was expected that the case would be transferred to some other county.

Miller shot Benge in the town of Eden on Sept. 17th, the killing taking place on the business streets of that town and was the culmination of trouble between Miller and Benge, which was made more serious when Benge last spring shot and killed Miller's son-in-law, Will Bryant, while Bryant was delivering mail at the Benge home.

The grand jury found two other felony indictments and adjourned Tuesday evening, the indictments returned being for violation of the prohibition law, and for burglary.

GRAND JURY IS AT WORK AT PAINT ROCK

PAINT ROCK, Oct. 12.—The grand jury is known to be taking testimony in the Miller case, growing out of the killing of Tom Benge by Sheriff Bob Miller at Eden, on Sept. 17. Witnesses from Eden are here to appear before the grand jury.

Court is passing on civil cases this week, and the criminal docket will not be called until next Monday. A man by the name of Martin, who is charged with killing his son in a quarrel over their crop last fall, will be arraigned for trial Monday. Martin is now in the Tom Green county jail, having been unable to make bond in the sum of \$10,000.

ATTEMPT TO MURDER HEAD LADY OF KLAN

ATLANTA, Ga., Oct. 12.—Several steel jacketed bullets and a trail of footsteps ending at a road is all the police have to work on in today's inquiry into what they characterize as an evident attempt last night to assassinate Mrs. Elizabeth Tyler, head of the women's department of the Ku Klux Klan.

Five shots were fired into the bedroom window at Mrs. Tyler's home she reported this morning. Several bullets were found embedded in the walls.

A mysterious telephone call was received at the office of the Atlanta Constitution half an hour after the shooting, and a man's voice said: "I just want to say we got Mrs. Tyler tonight and we will get Col. Simmons tomorrow."

SURVEYING CORPS CAMPING IN PARK

Chief Engineer C. C. Holder and corps of about a dozen surveyors are camped in the Colorado river park at the foot of Eighth Street, where they are at home for the winter, or until the work of making a survey of the Colorado river irrigation project is completed.

These men are on one of the most important jobs even assigned to a bunch of men in West Texas. Much depends on their findings, and so far we are glad to say the indications are that their findings will be favorable for constructing one of the largest irrigation projects in the Southwest.

The surveyors complete their day's work about five o'clock each afternoon, and come to camp. It is upto Ballinger people to make them feel at home. ASKS EDITORS TO DISARM PRESS

HONOLULU, Oct. 12.—The formal opening of the Press Congress of the World, convening in annual convention here yesterday, was marked by the reading of a message from President Harding by W. P. Farrington, governor of Hawaii.

Walter Williams, president of the international newspaper men's convention, of Columbia, Missouri, in his annual address, called upon the journalists to disarm the typewriters of the jingo press of the world, and said that through such accomplishment the limitation of armament would become a reality. Mr. Williams also broached a plan for forming "a league of journalists—dedicated to ending secret diplomacy and imperialism, and which would promote fair play and justice, sponsoring harmony and friendliness."

PLANS COMPLETE FOR RECEPTION

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—The final arrangements for the reception and entertainment of Marshal Foch on his forthcoming visit to the United States to attend the American Legion convention were made public today by the Legion reception committee in charge of the noted Frenchman's tour. The marshal will arrive on the New York liner Paris on October 29th, with General Pershing.

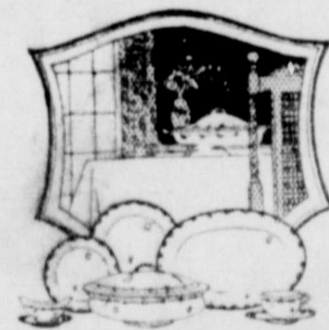

SEEKS AID FOR RURAL SCHOOLS

County Superintendent Bugg and Prof. John F. Priddy, of the Wingo school, returned from Austin Tuesday evening, making the trip to Austin and return since Sunday in a car. The gentlemen went to Austin to file in person application for aid for the rural schools of Runnels county. The application was the second one filed, Collin county being the only county in the state to get ahead of Runnels county, and the time limit for filing application for state aid expires on Oct. 15th.

Mr. Bugg made application for an average of \$600 for each school in the county, or approximately \$24,000. Every application was accompanied by a picture of the school building, and there were forty-two applications.

The department of education informed Mr. Bugg that the million and a half dollars appropriated for state aid would give every school in the county an average of \$350. Mr. Bugg is very optimistic over the prospects of this county getting all asked for, as the requirements are believed to have been complied with in every respect. Much credit is due Mr. Bugg for his untiring efforts in rushing the applications and getting the matter before the department in person.
Prof. Priddy is working for legislation for the Wingo school and looked after this while in Austin.

Secretary Williams of the Colorado Valley Irrigation Association went to San Angelo yesterday to confer with the Kiwanis Club of that city with reference to assisting in the project. The San Angelo citizens expressed themselves as being interested in the scheme, but stated that they had been so engrossed with local problems that they had been unable to devote much attention to the irrigation proposition.

Mr. Williams returned to San Angelo this afternoon to meet with the directors of the Board of City Development and explain the scheme to them in detail. HAGAN SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Special music had been prepared for the occasion by the faculty and some brief yet very interesting talks were made by members of the board of trustees and by the principal, Miss Barth, of Eddy, Texas, and her assistant, Miss Burris, of Ballinger.

After the program, books and supplies were issued to the pupils, after which the school building was put in first class order by the over-enthusiastic group of pupils supervised by their respective teachers.

That the Hagan community is one of the most progressive communities in Runnels county is shown by the active interest which the people of that district take in the betterment of their school. During the summer months a cistern was built on the school grounds.

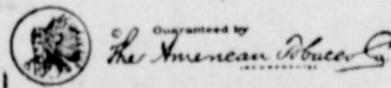

The school building was given a new foundation of rocks, hauled from Valley Creek, and the ground near the building was leveled; also unnecessary shrubbery was removed from the grounds.

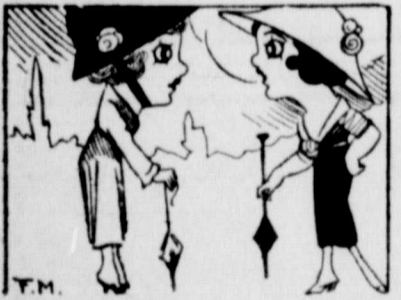

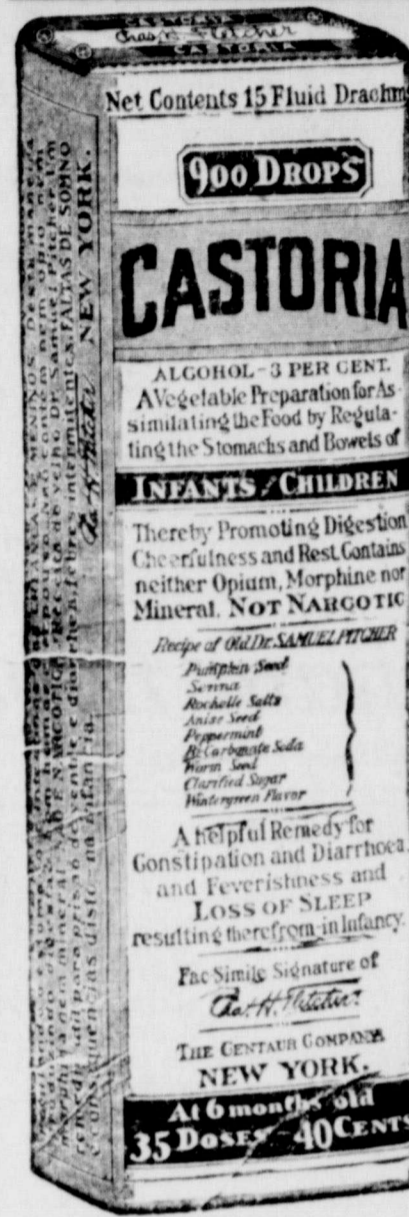

FAKE DOCTORS ARE CONVICTED

(San Angelo Standard)

H. B. Thompson, K. D. Thompson, J. G. McCoy, Captain A. F. McManus, Dr. H. Fitzgerald and Dr. O. R. Marshall, all connected with the Thompson Treatment Co., were found guilty in Federal Court at San Antonio Saturday on the first count of an indictment, charging the use of the mails in a scheme or artifice to defraud.

John Fitzsimmons, step-father of the two Thompson brothers, who testified to have originated the tuberculosis cure which the Thompson Co. was alleged to have promoted, was found not guilty on all four of the counts of the indictment.

Upon the request of the defense counsel, Federal Judge Duval West agreed to defer sentencing the convicted men until Tuesday, the request being asked on the grounds that the defense counsel required time in which to prepare a motion for a new hearing. The men found guilty were taken to jail.

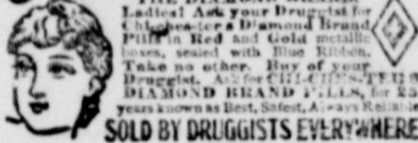

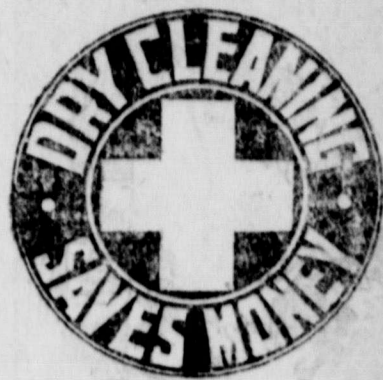
