

In the East the celebration of the two events continued for some time after the separate feast of Christmas had been instituted. The Church of Jerusalem stood out until the Seventh century, refusing to adopt the new feast. The Armenian church knows nothing of December 25, and still celebrates the Nativity with the Epiphany in January. Epiphany is a greater festival in the Greek church than Christ-


