AUSTIN, Jan. 12.—Headquarters Troop of the 56th Cavalry FIRST STATE BANK AT Brigade, Texas National Guard, at Brenham, has been ordered to entrain for Mexia.

Major Crawford, in command of the brigade, issued orders for the troop to entrain and proceed to Mexia at once, following instructions from Adjutant General Barton by wire.

The troop consists of forty men and the organization will arrive at Mexia shortly after midnight tonight.

AUSTIN, Jan. 12.—By a proclamation issued today Governor Neff declared martial law for Mexia and the surrounding oil field country.
