Charley Borders died Tuesday afternoon, and was buried at Center Valley Wednesday afternoon. He was poisoned Saturday morning, and physicians called from Lallinger to assist the Norton ortsician in an attempt to save the man's life, but the arsenic poison had done its work, and death resulted after four days of suffering. 





Meaning of the Carat Mark.

When you buy a watch or a ring or any other article of jewelry you generally find the mark, "14k," on it if it is made of gold of that proportion. But as to just how much gold there is in a 14k gold ring, few people know Some gold is 18k and some 22k.

Just as the name "sterling" stamps allverware as being made of solid silver so the carat marks on goldware indicate the amount of gold used in making it. Gold is divided into twenty-four carats, the "k" mark meaning "carat." Pure gold contains twenty-four carats. The mark "14k" on an object made of gold means that most generally used in the manufacture of lewelry.
