Hornsby Goes to Death Maintaining Innocence

BELTON, Tex., April 14.—At twelve minutes after two o'clock this afternoon Sheriff Bond, of Bell county, sprung the trap which sent George Hornsby to his death in paying the penalty for the murder of J. N. Weathersby at Brownwood on October 18, 1920.

While the execution was private, about seventy-five officers and invited parties witnessed the hanging which took place in the yard of the jail, a scaffold being specially constructed for the hanging. Hornsby went to his death maintaining his innocence, simply stating when given a chance to make a last statement, that he was "still innocent."

There was no demonstration or interference on the part of those who have been making heroic efforts to save Hornsby's life.

The execution of Hornsby marks the first hanging of a white man in Bell county for about sixty years. Friends of the doomed man are reported to have made up money yesterday to pay for his funeral.

George Hornsby was returned to Belton yesterday, being brought here from Austin in an automobile accompanied by officers and guards. The man was removed from the Belton jail and carried to Austin for safekeeping about two weeks ago when Willie Carter appeared in Bell county and made a statement to the effect that he had lied in furnishing evidence in convicting Hornsby, saying that a man by the name of Brown murdered Weathersby.

Before being removed from the Austin jail and brought back to Belton, it is claimed that Hornsby wrote a letter to Mrs. Bennett Smith, of Temple, the lady who

has been working to save Hornsby's life, and who wrote him a few days ago that she would stand on the gallows with him. The letter follows:

"Austin, Tex., April 11, 1922.
Mrs. Bennett Smith,
518 North Main Street,
Temple, Texas.

"Dear Mrs. Smith: I received your letter and was so glad to hear from you and the other lady. I also got a telegram from Miss Katye and I want to thank one and all for what they have done for me for some day they will know I am innocent. I hope something can be done before it is too late. Bill wrote Judge Snodgrass and told him the statement he made in Temple was true. I don't see how the good people of Texas can let an innocent man hang, for God in heaven knows I am innocent. I have prayed for God to open the people's eyes and show them that I am innocent; that they might do something to prevent me from going to my death of the gallows. I am willing and ready to die a natural death. God in heaven only knows how I have suffered, and if it is His will for me to go that way, just tell my friends that I will see them in heaven. I don't know when they will bring me to Belton, but I want you and Miss Katye to be there, for I want to talk with you before I die.

"From your friend,
"GEORGE F. HORNSBY."

Several Brownwood people, directly interested in the case, went to Belton to be present at the execution of Hornsby. A strong death watch was maintained around the jail last night, and a strong guard detailed to prevent any demonstration during the hanging.

The Carter boy, who furnished the clue which brought Hornsby to justice, and who retracted his statement in Temple, and who came to Brownwood and told a different story, and later was carried before Gov. Neff and held to his original story that Hornsby was the guilty man, is alleged to have written Judge Snodgrass at Temple a letter after being brought back to Brownwood from Austin in which he again declared that Hornsby was innocent.

The officers believe that the letter alleged to have been written to Judge Snodgrass, attorney for Hornsby, refuting the statement made to the governor, was written by another inmate of the jail and smuggled out. The letter was forwarded to Gov. Neff, but the governor paid no attention to it.

PLANTING NEW FISH CROP HERE

The Young Men's Business League is taking steps toward having all of the streams of Runnels county restocked with fish. Most of the good fishing holes dried up during the "recent unpleasantness," and as most of the fish died, it will be necessary to secure a new supply from the Fish and Game Commission and turn them over to land owners who live near streams and who will protect the fish until they have secured growth.

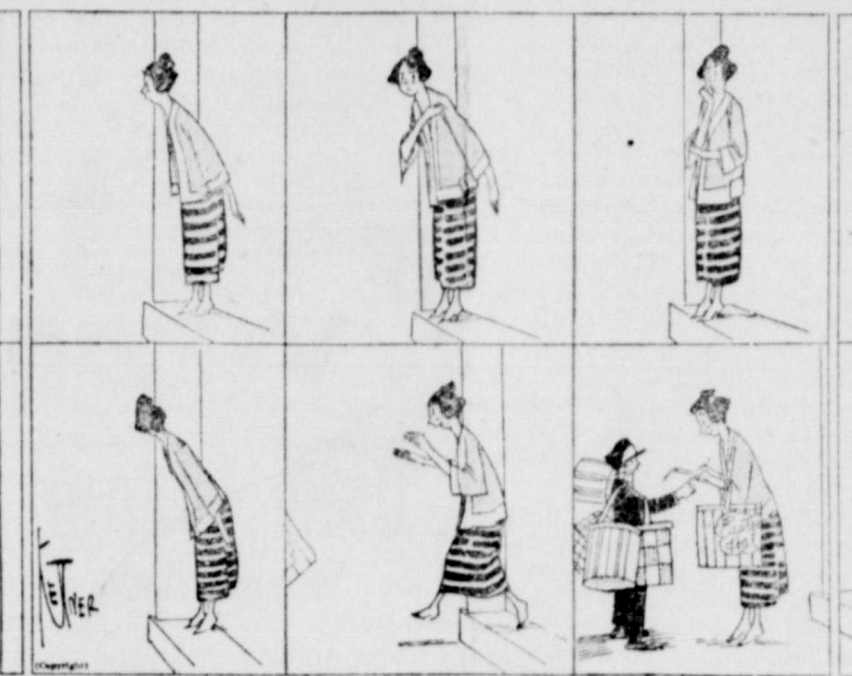

AUTO PULLMAN LINE IS ESTABLISHED

SAN ANGELO, April 14.—The operation of what is said to be the first auto pullman service in Texas or the Southwest will begin on May 1st. Auto pullman cars will on that day begin operation both from San Angelo and San Antonio, in either case going from either town to the other. This new service is to be placed in operation by the San Angelo and Gulf Transportation Co. J. W. Owens and E. G. Potter, both of San Antonio, are the promoters of the new company. There will be double daily service between San Angelo and San Antonio. The day service will be by auto busses of the latest approved type. The night service will be by auto pullman cars.

5 INCENDIARY FIRES STARTED

Messer, and a small outhouse in the edge of town.

FIGHT FOR LARGER NAVY CAUSES STIR IN HOUSE

POKER PLAYING DEACONS FREED

DENISON, April 14.—"Poker playing Deacons" were today freed of the charge of card playing which the Grayson county grand jury filed against them two months ago. Seven prominent business men of the Rod and Gun Club, a private club near the city, were billed for playing cards by the grand jury. One of the number was tried Thursday afternoon, and acquitted, the jury being out five minutes. The other six cases were immediately dismissed.

FINANCIAL TROUBLE BEFORE CONFERENCE

GENOA, April 14.—Europe's financial tangle was brought to the front for consideration at today's session of the Genoa conference. Further discussion of the Russian affairs have been postponed until tomorrow.

GENOA, April 14.—A divergence of opinion over Russia is reported to have developed at the meeting today of the economic conference of the Big Four in discussing Russian problems.

RADIO GRANTED FOR PRESS USE

WASHINGTON, April 14.—A bill extending the use of the government's naval radio facilities for commercial and press service until June 1925, was signed today by President Harding.

WASHINGTON, April 14.—Changing their plans at the last moment, the members leading the move for an enlisted personnel of 86,000 in the navy, made no attempt at the opening of the House today to force over until next week a vote on the contested section of the bill.

WASHINGTON, April 14.—President Harding, it is understood, sent a letter to the capitol today urging that the navy's enlisted strength be reduced to below 86,000.

WASHINGTON, April 14.—The House leaders, in a fight for the 86,000 enlisted force amendment to the naval appropriations bill, strove to prevent a vote tomorrow when most of the membership will be absent from Washington. Claiming enough strength to win either on a vote today or next week, the "big navy" men indicated that they would attempt to bring about adjournment over the week end, and if failing in that they were ready to prolong the five minute debate on early sections of the bill in order to make it impossible for the chairman to demand a vote on the enlisted provision tomorrow.

WASHINGTON, April 14.—Lines were drawn in the House today for a battle over the personnel section of the naval appropriations bill providing for an enlisted force of 65,000. Both sides are claiming a victory in a vote on the amendment to increase the force to eighty thousand men with six thousand apprentice seamen, as against two thousand apprentice seamen as provided in the original bill.

crumb in the meal barrel or salt in the cellar.

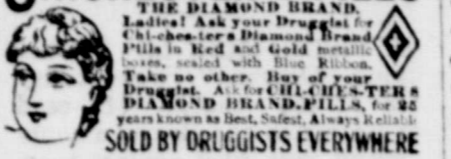

FATHER AND SON BODIES BURIED

The bodies of Sterling Hornsby and his nine year old son, who were drowned in the Colorado river during the high water last week near Waldrip, in McLulloch county, have been recovered. The bodies were found about fifty miles apart, and both found about the same time.

While a party of searchers was following the river near where the drowning occurred, and the body of the father found, the boy's body came to the surface about fifty miles further down the stream.

The bodies were in such decomposed condition they were buried immediately near where they were recovered, the father being buried at Waldrip and his son at Zephyr.

The father and son attempted to cross the river in a wagon just as the high rise began to come down last week. Their wagon and team drifted down stream, the team was drowned and both persons lost their lives.

Hornsby's mother lives four miles from Blanket, and during last November, another son, John Hornsby, was dragged to death by a mule. A number of years ago the unfortunate man's father was killed in a gin accident, and the recent drownings make four tragic deaths in the Hornsby family. This Hornsby family is not related to the George Hornsby who was hanged at Belton Friday.

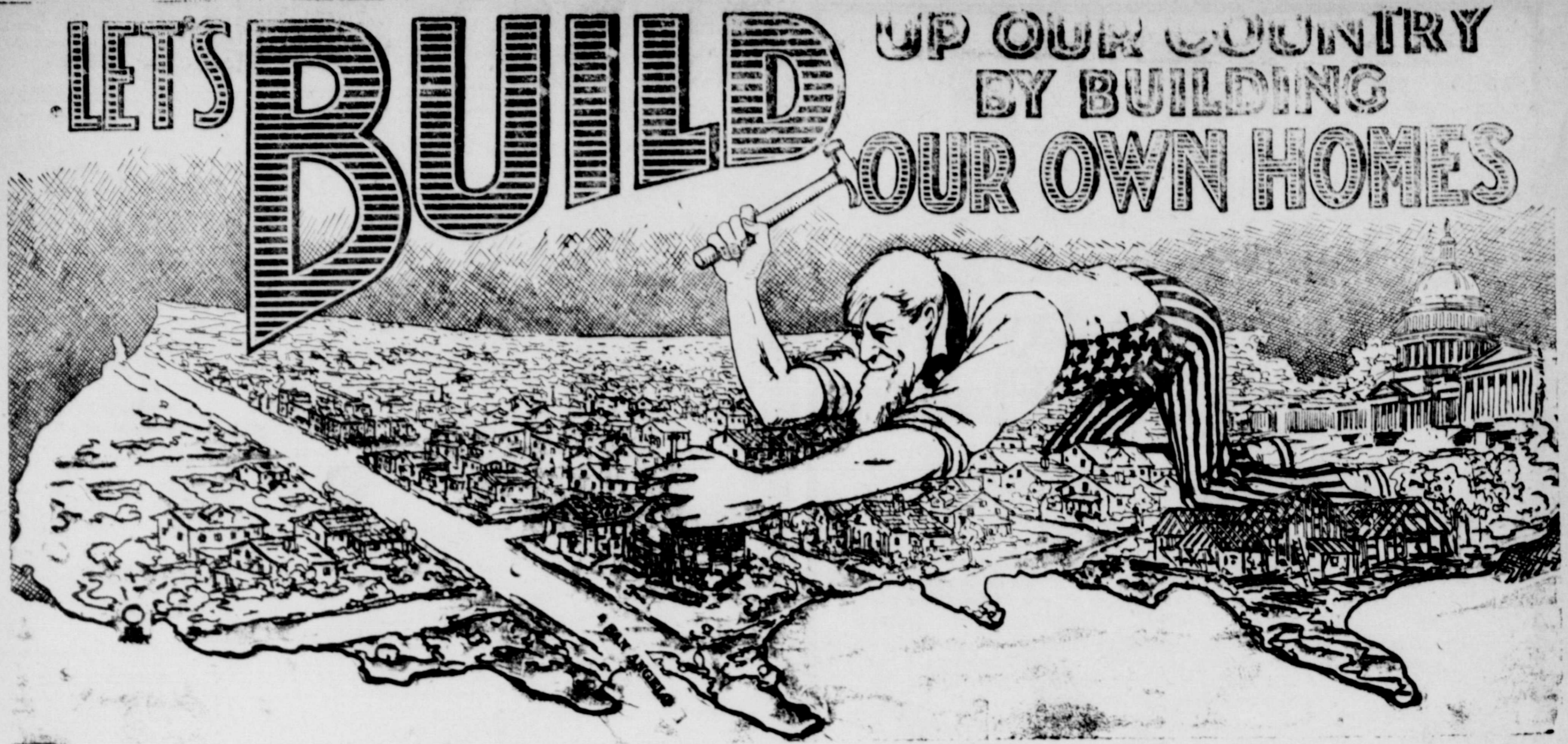
