

BENJAMIN—Milo maire worth \$5 to \$6 per ton in Knox county this year was sold for \$17.6 per ton fed to \$6 xeers by Jack Idol. Manager of the Lesgue Ranch. Steers wurth \$928.80 were last January put on wheat pasture and a ration of ground maire and cottonseed which was jater auphemented with wheat, oast, cornand hegar bundles. At the end of 145 days the steers had gained 261 pounds and were sold at an average weight of \$77 pounds for \$1331.00 net. All ranch grown feeds were charged at top local prices and the profit expressed in terms of \$459 tons of maire fed, whiled was figured to have brought at least three times its market price.
